Vienna, May 2. N. S. Sunday last having been appointed a Day of solemn Devotion, for imploring a Blessing on the Arms of his Imperial Majesty and his Allies in this ensuing Campaign, there was a general Procession of all the Orders of the Clergy, with great Numbers of the Laity, from the Church of the barefoot Augustin Friars to the Cathedral, at which the Emperor and Empress assisted, being attended by the whole Court. The Diet of Hungary is still taken up in preparing a Representation of the Grievances of that Kingdom, which they judge necessary to be redress'd, in order to soften the Minds of the People, and incline them to Terms of Accommodation. The Malecontents have invested *Doris*, and attack'd it with great Vigor, in hopes to be Masters of it before any Troops can come to its Relief. They have posted some Troops near *Gini*, a little below *Javain*, and others at *Karawar*, to interrupt the Navigation of the *Danube*. A Courier is arriv'd here from *Milan*, with Advice That *Marshal Staremberg* left that Place on the 17th of the last Month, and went to *Genoa*, intending to embark for *Barcelona* with the first Opportunity.

Copenhagen, May 8. N. S. The 27th of the last Month being the Anniversary of the Queen-Mother's Birth-Day, on which her Majesty enter'd into the 58th Year of her Age, the King, the whole Court, all the foreign Ministers, and Persons of Distinction of both Sexes, made their Compliments of Congratulation to her Majesty on that Occasion. The King and the Court, for the greater Conveniency, din'd at the Place appointed for the Honours of the Day. After Dinner, a Caroussel was perform'd with extraordinary Address and Magnificence. His Majesty confer'd a blue Ribbon, being the Order of the Elephant, on Count *Anthony* of *Altenburg*; and three

white Ribbons, the Order of *Dannebrog*, on *Monsieur Plessen*, first Chamberlain to *Prince Charles*; *Montieur Ketchaw*, Marshal to the Queen-Mother; and the third to *Monsieur Plaro*, Marshal to the King. The Swedish Envoy has lately presented a Letter to the King, sign'd by his Majesty of Sweden and the Duke of *Wolfenbuttel*, as Directors of the Circle of Lower Saxony, wherein his Danish Majesty is inform'd of the March of the Troops of the Circle towards *Hamburg*, pursuant to an Imperial Commission lately issu'd out for composing the Disorders of that City.

Berne, May 5. N. S. We have yet no Account from *Zurich*; that the Ratifications of the Treaty of Neutrality for *Neuchâtel* are exchange'd, tho' we do not hear that there hath arisen any new Incident which may occasion further difficulty or delay; the French Ambassador having assur'd the Cantons, that the Ratification sent him from Court is exactly in the same Form as was agreed upon at the Diet of *Arrau*. The last Letters this Canton hath receiv'd from their Deputies at *Zurich* say, they are in hopes of Accommodating the Differences about the Business of *Tockenburgh* in such a manner, that the Protestants of that Country will be still more secure in the free Enjoyment of their Religion and Liberties.

Hamburg, May 6. N. S. The Troops of the Princes who have taken upon 'em to quiet our Disorders, are approaching this City; and upon the receiving that Intelligence, the Ministers of *Saxony*, *Prussia*, *Hanover* and *Wolfenbuttel* are gone from hence, in order to concert Measures with the Commanding Officers of the respective Forces belonging to their Masters. In the mean time the Ministers of Great Britain, Denmark, and the States General continue here. Count *Guldenstern*, who is to command in Chief on this Occasion, sent an Officer on the fifth Instant into the Territory of *Bergdorff*, to let them know those Forces would Rendezvous there on the 12th Instant, and that a certain Sum of Money, with all manner of Provisions, must necessarily be prepared before their Arrival, without which he could not answer for the safety of the Neighbourhood against the Disorders which usually arise among Troops when such Precautions are neglected. The Senate and all the States of the City assembled Yesterday, to consider what may be proper for them to act in a conjuncture wherein the Interest of the City of *Lubeck* is also concern'd, that Place having a joint Property with *Hamburg* over the Territory of *Bergdorff*; but the Council were so divided in their Opinions, that they broke up without coming to any Resolution.

Brussels, May 14. N. S. His Grace the Duke of *Marborough* having taken an Account of the good Condition of our Troops in *Garrifoa* at *Ghent*, and given the necessary Orders for their taking the Field, left that Place the 11th Instant, and came hither in the Afternoon. Upon his Arrival he was waited on by the Council of State, the General Officers, and other Persons of Quality, who came to welcome his Grace into this Country. He will continue here for a few Days longer, while the Army is assembling, all the Troops at any distance being now in Motion towards their Rendezvous. Letters from the Enemies Frontiers say, the Dukes of *Burgundy* and *Berry* are expected at *Valencianes* the 17th, and that the Elector of *Bavaria* was to set out this Day for the Upper-Rhine. He proposes to meet the Duke of *Berwick* at *Strasbourg* on the 20th of this Month, and by that time to have brought together the Troops in those Parts. Those of *Bavaria*, *Cologne*, and several Spanish Regiments are on their March that way from this Country.

Hague, May 15. N. S. We have Reports from several parts, That there has been an Action between 6000 Swedish Horse, and a Body of Muscovite Foot, the Success whereof is variously reported. Vice-Admiral *Peterfon*, who commands the Squadron which is to Cruise near *Dunkirk*, set out this Day, in order to go on Board and Sail with the first fair Wind.
