At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 8th day of June 1967.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Minister of Housing and Local Government that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in St. Peter's Churchyard in the Parish of Hope, near Sheffield, in the County of Derby, has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 23rd day of March 1967, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act, 1853 (1853, c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in St. Peter's Churchyard in the said Parish.

Provided that—

In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard the burial may be allowed of the bodies of Gertrude Ashton, Adam Barber, Ruth Barber, Annie S. Bullivant, Enid Dora Collett, Georgina Cooper, Minnie Corbett, Alfred Fawcett, Sylvia Fawcett, Lillian Green, William H. Green, Edna Hadfield, Lucy Ann Hadfield, Matthew Hadfield, Maud Hadfield, Ann Eliza Kirk, Sarah Longden, Esther Potts, Mary Rideout, Eva Sealey, Edna May Shenton, Sarah Jane Spencer, Anne E. Sutton, Ada Townsend, Fanny Walker, Catherine Wells, Phillip Bailey Wells, Kate Whitehirst, Abraham Wilson, Edith Augusta Wilson, Fanny Woodall and Elizabeth Wright, subject in each case to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (St. Peter's Churchyard, Hope, Derbyshire), Order 1967.
