### UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT 1923

New Statutes made by the Governing Body of the College of the Lady Margaret in the University of Oxford, on the 16th June 1967, have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923.

#### . TREASURY

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank

- of England on Friday the 21st July 1967, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £250,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 24th July to Saturday the 29th July 1967, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated. relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- The Lord Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under section 203 of the Customs and Excise Act 1952.

Viz.: The Hydrocarbon Oil Duties (Drawback) (No. 1) Order 1967.

This Order consolidates the provisions governing the allowance of drawback of customs or excise duty on hydrocarbon oil used in the manufacture or preparation of certain lubricating oil additives and lubricating oil viscosity modifiers, subject in the case of the former to alteration of the rates used for determining the quantity of oil in respect of which drawback is allowed.

The Order also revokes a number of Drawback Orders which have become spent as a result of the relief from hydrocarbon oil duty granted by section 6 (1) of the Finance Act 1964 in respect of oil used in the manufacture or preparation of other articles.
