Turin, May 19. N. S. The fecond Battalion of General Schulentlerg march'd from this Place on the 12th Instant, in order to go to the Vall-d'Aost, where it is to ferve this Campaign. Signior Tiepolo, the late Ambaffador of the Republick of Venice to France, is arriv'd here from Paris, on his return home, and has had the Honour to wait upon his Royal Highness, and afterwards upon the Durchesses Consort and Dowager. On the 15th the Prince of Wirtemberg left this Place, to go and visit some of the Imperial Troops which are cancon'd at Rivoli, and the parts adjacent. Major-General Stanhope having receiv'd an Express from Genoa, that her Majesty's Ships the Milford and Foway were come in there, set on from hence on the 16th for Savona, where they are or der'd to take him on Board, and Sail to Barcelona. By elles is Dead. General Zumjungen arriv'd here on the 17th from Milan, to give his Royal Highness an account of the Condition of the Imperial Troops, and to receive his Orders for their Disposition, as to their March out of their Quarters. This Officer return yellerday Morning, carrying Orders from his Royal Highness to General Visconii for the Troops to begin their March the next Week for these Parts, the Prussians first, and then the Imperialists, so that we hope our Army may be affembled by the end of the next Month at Buffoin, which is appointed for the place of Rendezvous. The Regiment of Colonel des Portes march'd from hence this Morning for the Vall-d'Aost, to reinforce the Troops which his Royal Highness has in those parts. His Royal Highness has already hired 4000 Muless and given Orders for the hiring of 3000 more, which are thought fuffici-ent for the use of the whole Army during the Campaign. We do not yet hear, that the Mareschal de Villars is arriv'd on our Frontier; but are inform'd, that the Duke of Berwick's Equipages were on the way as far as Grenoble, when they receiv'd Orders to return and join him on the Rhine, where he is to Command under the Eiector of Bavaria

From the Campat Ferbanck, June 4. N. S. On Friday the 1st Instant, about 10 at Night, the Enemy decamp'd from Soignies without any Noise; of which His Grace the Duke of Marlborough having Notice at four the next Morning, gave Orders for our Army to be immediately in a Readiness to narch; but part of our Horse being already gone out for Forage, the Signal was made for their Return, by firing three Pieces of Cannon. We march'd accordingly the whole Night, and came yester lay to this Camp, with the Right at the Abby of Correberg, and the Lest at Ferbanck. The Enemy, who had given out the Delign of their March was to possess themselves of Louvain, to prevent our passing the Dyle, upon notice of our advancing this way, encamped on Saturday Night with their Right near Genappe, and their Left at Braine L'Aleu, where they still continue. The Enemies marching in the Night gave an Opportunity to great Numbers of their Men to defert, and several small Bodies came over to us on the March, with Serjeants and Drums at their Heads. 'The Convoy and Transports from Harwich, having on Board a Batta-lion of Her Majesty's Guards, and two Regiments of Foot, arriv'd the first Instant at Ostend; the Men landed the next Day, and march'd to Bruges, where Boucs were ready to transport them to Ghent, from whences after a few Days rest, they are to march to the Army.
