Public Path Extinguishment Order 1967

Notice is hereby given that on 22nd August 1967 the Minister of Housing and Local Government in pursuance of his powers under subsection (5) of section 112 of the Highways Act 1959, made the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish as from 19th September 1967, the public right of way over part of Footpath No. 7 at Pin Mill, Chelmondiston, which runs from Pin Mill Road to Clamp House, Pin Mill, being that part which starts on Pin Mill Road between the properties known as Ferry Lodge and Richmond Cottage and runs generally east for a distance of approximately 84 feet to the western boundary of the allotment gardens and then follows generally north-east along the said boundary for a distance of approximately 315 feet to its junction with footpath No. 7A at the north-eastern corner of the said gardens.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order made by the Minister has been deposited at the offices of the Samford Rural District Council, 25 London Road, Ipswich, East Suffolk, and at the Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, and may be inspected during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from 19th September 1967, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied

with in relation to the approval of the Order he may within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1962

*Imposition of 40 m.p.h. Speed Limit at
Keighley, Yorks*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport intends to make an Order under section 11 (1) of the Road Traffic Act 1962 prohibiting the driving of motor vehicles at a speed exceeding 40 m.p.h. in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Part of this length of road i.e. from the junction with Bradford Road to the junction with Lawkholme Lane is at present subject to a speed limit of 30 m.p.h.

Any objection to the making of the Order should be sent to the Divisional Road Engineer, Ministry of Transport, City House, Leeds 1, not later than the 30th September 1967, quoting the reference number RDN. 3584/65/1.

SCHEDULE

That length of the North-West of Doncaster—Wakefield—Bradford—Skipton—Kendal Trunk Road (A.650) known as Hard Ings Road, in the Borough of Keighley in the County of York, West Riding which extends from the junction with Skipton Road (A.629) to the junction with Bradford Road, a distance of approximately 980 yards.

PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS, 1937 AND 1948

Botswana

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food gives notice in pursuance of the above-named Regulations that he hereby recognises for the purposes of importation of carcase meat and canned meat from Botswana the Official Certificate of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as showing (a) that the meat to which it relates or the meat from which the meat product to which it relates was prepared, was derived from animals inspected ante and post mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Minister and (b) that all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health were taken in the dressing or preparing and packing of the meat or meat product.

The Certificate is in the form of a stamp and recognition will only apply if it is clearly shown on the meat or the package containing the meat or meat product.

The Certificate is recognised in addition to that published in the *London Gazette* on 30th September 1966.
