The Dukinfield (Hall Green) Smoke Control Order (No. 12) 1967

Notice is hereby given that the Dukinfield Borough Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act, 1956, on the 12th day of June 1967, made an Order entitled the Dukinfield (Hall Green) Smoke Control Order (No. 12) 1967, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st day of July 1968, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

Notice is hereby given that the Meriden Rural District Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act 1956, on the 12th day of September 1967, made an Order entitled the Meriden Rural District Council (No. 2) Smoke Control Order 1967, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include Anthracite, Phurnacite, Coke, Coalite, Rexco, Welsh Dry Steam Coal, Homefire, Multiheat, Gas and Electricity. By virtue of the Smoke Control (Exempted Fireplaces) Order, 1957, fireplaces which are specially designed or adapted for combustion of liquid fuel shall, provided that they are so installed, maintained and operated as to minimise the emission of smoke, be exempted from the provisions of the Order.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st day of October 1968, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at The Council House, Coleshill, Birmingham, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 19th day of September 1967.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to The Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

The area of 348 acres contained within the following boundaries:

The Chester Road from Bacons End north-westward to the Kingshurst-Castle Bromwich parish boundary; the Kingshurst-Castle Bromwich parish boundary south-westward to the City of Birmingham boundary; the boundary of the Meriden Rural District with the City of Birmingham southward to the River Cole; the River Cole to Cooks Lane; Cooks Lane eastward to Bacons End.
