S. T. James's, June 4. The following Addresses have been presented to Her Majesty.

To the *QUEEN's* most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Address of the Royal Boroughs of *Scotland*; presented to Her Majesty by Sir *David Nairne*.

WE your Majesty's most loyal and dutiful Subjects the Representatives of the Royal Boroughs in the present Convention, do most humbly represent, That this being the first time we could meet together, since the last happy Declaration of this Part of your Majesty's Kingdom of Great Britain, from the threaten'd Invasion, we thought our selves bound in all Duty to concur with your Majesty's other faithful Subjects, in expressing our utmost Abhorrence and Detestation of that wicked Design of the French King to invade your Dominions: We do most heartily congratulate the Success of your Majesty's Navy and Arms, so speedily and seasonably provided to defeat that horrid Enterprize: We do likewise, in all humble Duty, give your Majesty full Assurance, that we shall never be wanting to maintain and defend your Majesty's Royal Person, and Succession in the Protestant Line, against all Attempts of the Pretender and his Adherents: And that the divine Protection may be always towards your sacred Person and Government; that your Councils and Arms may be ever attended with Success; and that, by the Blessing of God, your Life and Reign may be long and prosperous, is and shall be the constant Prayer of Sec.

The three following Addresses were transmitted from *Scotland* by the Right Honourable the Earl of *Seafield*, and presented to her Majesty by the Right Hon. the Lord High Treasurer.

The humble Address of the Ministers of the Presbytery of *Forayce* in *Banff* Shire.

The humble Address of the Provost, Bailiffs, Council, and others of the Burgh of *Banff*, in that part of *North-Britain* call'd *Scotland*, for themselves and in Name of the Community thereof.

The humble Address of the Magistrates, Council, and Inhabitants of the Burgh of *Cullen*, within the County of *Banff* in *North-Britain*, met at *Cullen* the eighth Day of *May*, 1708.

All which Addresses her Majesty receiv'd very graciously.

Berne, June 2. N. S. Letters from *Turin* in the 23d of the last Month say, that Major-General *Stanhope* set Sail from *Savona* on the 18th for *Barcelona* with so fair a Wind, that 'twas not doubted but he was safely arriv'd there. On the 19th her Majesty's Ship the *Centurion* arriv'd at *Genoa* from *Barcelona* with Letters of the 4th of the last Month, by which there was Advice, that in a Council of War held upon the Arrival of *Marshall Staremberg* and *Monsieur Belasieb*, it had been resolv'd to take the Field on the 14th of the same Month. We hear from *Genoa*, that *Admiral Leake* was every day expected there; and that all things were in a readiness for the Embarkation as soon as he shall arrive.

Copenhagen, June 5. N. S. The Prussian Secretary has receiv'd Orders to declare at this Court, That the King his Master had no Intention of offering any Prejudice to the Rights of the Nobility, by sending his Troops into the Dutchy of *Mecklenburg*, but only to secure to himself his Right of Succession to that Dutchy. The King of *Denmark* has lately receiv'd two Letters from the King of *Prussia*; one whereof notify'd his Prussian Majesty's having accepted the Title and Arms of Duke of

Mecklenburg; the other was a Signification of the Death of his Grandson. There is a Report here, That the *Swedes* were fitting out several Ships of War at *Carelsroon* and *Gottenburg*.

Berlin, June 5. N. S. The Prince and Princess Royal have waited some Days for the Arrival of the Electress of *Hanover* here; but there being now no Expectation of that Visit, the Prince's Court is gone to *Westerhausen*, where they will reside for a Season. Letters from *Carlsbad* inform us, That the King has begun to drink those Waters; and 'tis suppos'd the Benefit which he already receives from them, will incline his Majesty to stay longer there than he at first intended. Advices from the King of *Sweden's* Quarters at *Kadoskrewitz* of the 9th of the last Month say, That his Swedish Majesty had charg'd a Courier from the *Czar* to tell his Master, that he yet continu'd in the Resolution of coming into *Moscow*. They write from *Warlaw* of the 29th past, That the Grand General of the Crown having conducted his Lady to *Skolon* upon the Frontiers of *Hungary*, where she is to have a Conference with *Prince Ragotski*, was return'd to *Jaroslaw*; from whence he will go directly to *Visko*, the Place appointed for the General Rendezvous of the Crown Army, which is to be assembled there before the end of this Month: In the mean time they daily expect, in that City, the Bishop and Palatine of *Culm* from *King Stanislaus*, and the Palatines of *Mazure* and *Lublin*, from the General of the Crown Army, to treat of an Accommodation; 'tis said, the latter, in order to facilitate this Affair, has agreed to a Cessation of Arms for a Month with the Palatine of *Kiow*, the chief Commander of the Troops which are in the Interests of *King Stanislaus*.

From the Camp at *Terbank*, June 11. N. S. On Friday the 8th Instant his Grace the Duke of *Marlborough* review'd the Right of the Foot of the first Line, consisting of all the British, and part of the *Hanover* Foot, and was extremely well satisfied with the Condition they appear'd in; the respective Bodies being very compleat, as well in Number as in Cloathing and Accoutrements. His Grace the Duke of *Marlborough* had the like Satisfaction in reviewing the next Day the rest of the Foot of the first Line, and this Day the Left Wing of the Horse of the same Line. On Saturday *Baron Daudignie's* Regiment of Spanish Dragoons march'd towards *Ghent*, where they will join the three English Battalions of Foot lately landed; which, together with some others to be drawn out of our Garrisons, are to form a Body of Troops under the Command of *Major-General Murray*, to observe any Motions the Enemy may make in *Flanders*. Our Army, and that of the Enemy, continue still in their former Camps.

Hague, June 12. N. S. Yesterday was the first Day the Grand Pensioner appear'd in the Assembly of the States since his late Indisposition. The last Letters from *France* confirm the Account we lately had, that *Admiral Leake* had taken the greater Part of an hundred Tartans laden with Corn and Ammunition for the Army commanded by the Duke of *Orleans*; those Vessels were bound from *Cera* to *Peniscola*, on the Coast of the Kingdom of *Valencia*. They write from *Italy*, that her Catholick Majesty arriv'd at *Brescia* on the 26th of the last Month, and was expected at *Milan* on the 31st. 'Tis advis'd from *Frankfort*, that his Electoral Highness of *Hanover* arriv'd there on the 7th Instant, but did not design to place himself at the Head of the Army till he had a Conference with *Prince Eugene* and the Elector of *Mayence*, who were expected at *Frankfort* the next Day. 'Tis said *Prince Eugene* will be at *Maeßtricht* the next Week.

Falmouth, May 31. On the 29th in the Evening sail'd the *Prince Pacquet*-boat, *Captain Chinnall* Commander, with one Mail for *Lisbon*.
