Berne, June 2. N. S. Letters from Turin of the 23d of the last Month say, that Major-General Stanhope fer Sail from Savona on the 18th for Barcelona with fo hir a Wind, that 'twas nor doubted but he was fifely arriv'd there. On the 19th her Majesty's Ship the Centurion arriv'd at Genoa f om Barcelona with Letters of the 4th of the latt Month, by which there was Advice, that in a Council of War held upon the Arrival of Marshal Scremberg and Monsieur Beleastel, it has even resolved to take the Field on the rath of the same Month. We hear from Genos, that Alimai Leake was every day expected there; and the fall things were in a readinate for pected there; and that all things were in a readinets for

the Embarkation as foon as he shall arrive.

Copenhagen, June 5. N. S. The Prussian Secretary his receiv'd Orders to declare at this Court, That the King his Master had no Intention of offering any Prejudice to the Rights of the Nobility, by fending his Troops into the Dutchy of Mecklenburg, but only to fecure to himself his Right of Succeifion to that Dutchy. The King of Denmark has lately received two Letters from the King of Pruffia, one whereof notify his Pruffian Majary's having accepted the Title and Arms of Duke of Mecklenburg; the other was a Signification of the Death of his Grandson. There is a Report here, That the Swedes were fitting out feveral Ships of War at Carelfcroon and

Gottenburg.

Berlin, June 5. N. S. The Prince and Prince's Royal have waited some Days for the Arrival of the Electress of Hanover here; but there being now no Expectation of that Vilit, the Prince's Court is gone to Westerhausen, where they will reside for a season. Letters from Carlsbadt ir-form us, That the King has began to drink those Waters; and 'tis suppos'd the Benefit which he already receives from them, will incline his Majesty to stay longer there than he at first intended. Advices from the King of Sweden's Quarters at Kadoskrewitz of the 9th of the last Month lay, That his Swedish Majesty had charg'd a Courier from the Czar to tell his Master, that he yet contirier from the Czar to tell his Malter, that he yet continu'd in the Refolution of coming into Molcovy. They write from Warfaw of the 29th past, That the Grand General of the Crown having conducted his Lady to Skoln upon the Frontiers of Hungary, where she is to have a Conference with Prince Ragotski, was return'd to Jaroslow; from whence he will go directly to Visko, the Place appointed for the General Rendezvous of the Crown Army, which is to be affembled there before the end of this Month: In the mean time they daily expect, in that City, the Bishop and Palatine of Culm from King Stanislaus, and the Palatines of Mazure and Lublin, from the General of the Crown Army, to treat of an Accommodation; itis faid, the latter, in order to facilitate this Affair, has agreed to a Cessation of Arms for a Month with the Palatine of Kiow, the chief Commander of the Troops which are in the Interests of King Stanislaus.

From the Camp at Terbank, June 11. N. S. On Friday the 8th Instant his Grace the Duke of Marlborough review'd the Right of the Foot of the first Line, confisting of all the British, and part of the Hanover Foot, and was extreamly well fatisfied with the Condition they appear'd in; the respective Bodies being very compleat, as well in Number as in Cloathing and Accourtements. His Grace the Duke of Marlborough had the like Satisfaction in reviewing the next Day the rest of the Foot of the first Line, and this Day the Left Wing of the Horse of the same Line. On Saturday Baron Daudignie's Regiment of Spanish Dragoons march'd towards Ghent, where they will join the three English Battalions of Foot lately landed; which, together with some others to be drawn out of our Garrifons, are to form a Body of Treops under the Command of Major-General Murray, to observe any Motions the Enemy may make in Flanders. Our Army, and that of

the Enemy, continue still in their former Camps.

Hague, June 12. N.S. Yesterday was the first Day the
Grand Pentioner appear'd in the Assembly of the States since
his late Indisposition. The less Letters from France confirm the Account we lately had, that Admiral Leake had taken the greater Fart of an hundred Tartans laden with ken the greater Part of an hundred Partans laten With Corn and Ammunition for the Army commanded by the Duke of Orleans; those Vessels were bound from Ceta to Peniscola, on the Coast of the Kingdom of Valencia. They write from Italy, that her Catholick Majesty arriv'd at Brescia on the 26th of the last Month, and was expected at Milan on the 31st. 'This advis'd from Frankfort, that his Electoral Highness of Hanover arriv'd tharm on the 7th Instant, but did not design to place there on the 7th Inflant, but did not defign to place himself at the Head of the Army till he had a Conserence with Prince Eugene and the Elector of Mayence, who were expected at Frankfort the next Day. 'Tis faid Prince Eugene will be at Macstricht the next Week.
