

3. to prohibit the loading and unloading of goods during the hours of 8 a.m. to 9.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. to 6.30 p.m. in the length of road specified in each Schedule to this Notice. This prohibition will not apply to a vehicle being used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets for the Post Office.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle (this exception will not apply during the hours specified in item 3 of this Notice); to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein; to enable the vehicle to be used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties but excepting that of refuse collection; or to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to any of the said lengths of road.

The restrictions referred to in items 2 of this Notice will not apply to a stage or express carriage service.

The Swansea-Manchester Trunk Road (Wynnstay Colliery Diversion Side Roads) Order, 1967

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he has made in relation to the above-mentioned Trunk Road near Wynnstay Colliery at Ruabon in the County of Denbigh and also to the proposed diversion of that Trunk Road near Wynnstay Colliery, an Order under section 9 of the above Act which will—

- (a) authorise the Secretary of State—
 - (i) to carry out improvements to Plas Bennion Lane,
 - (ii) to stop up lengths of the existing Trunk Road, and
 - (iii) to construct a new highway to connect the existing Trunk Road with the southern boundary of the route of the new trunk road all near Wynnstay Colliery, Ruabon aforesaid, and
- (b) provide for the transfer of the said new highway to the County Council of Denbigh as from the date on which the Secretary of State notifies

the Council that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.

Highways Act, 1959

The London-Fishguard and the Haverfordwest-Milford Haven Trunk Roads (Haverfordwest Southern By-Pass) Order, 1967.

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under sections 7 and 20 of the above Act providing—

- (a) that two roads which he proposes to construct at Haverfordwest in the County of Pembroke shall become trunk roads as from the date when the Order comes into operation, and
- (b) that the lengths of the London-Fishguard and Haverfordwest-Milford Haven Trunk Roads to be superseded shall cease to be trunk roads as from the 1st April next after the date on which notice is given by the Secretary of State to the County Council of Pembroke (who will become the highway authority responsible for those lengths) that the said new trunk roads are open for through traffic.
