PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Minister of Housing and Local Government, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of St. Andrew, Stainland, in the County of York, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in that part of St. Andrew's Churchyard in the said Parish shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that—

In any earthen grave now existing in the said part of the said Churchyard, the burial may be

allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

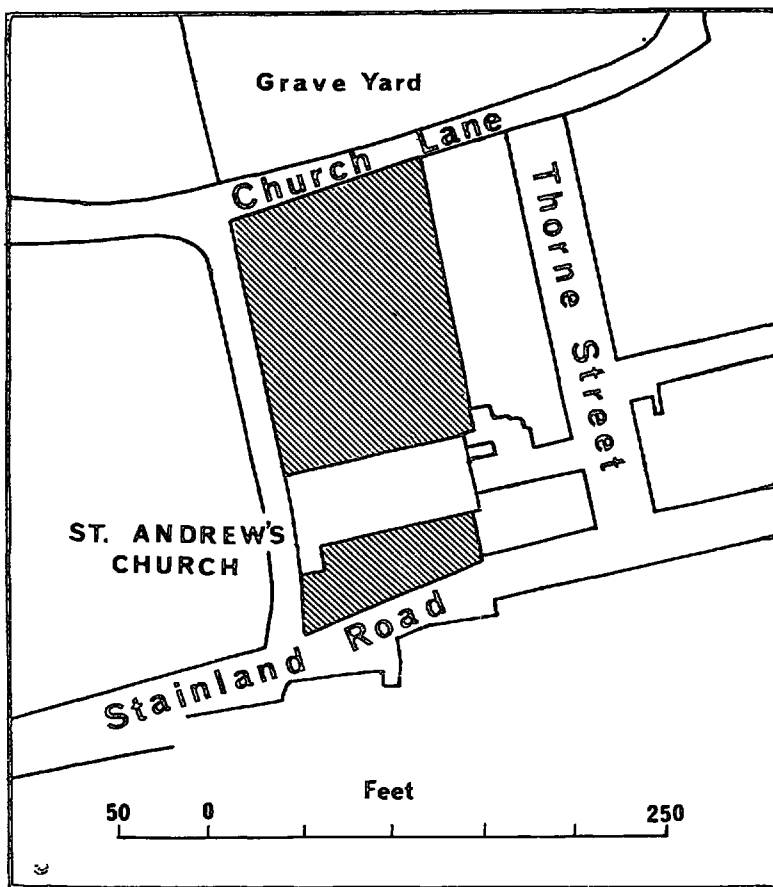
Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 5th day of March next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the *London Gazette*, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 5th day of March.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by the Suffragans Nomination Act 1888, it is enacted that from and after the passing of that Act for the purposes of the Act of the 26th year of the reign of King Henry the Eighth, Chapter 14, intituled "An Act for Nomination and Consecration of Suffragans within this Realm," such other Towns as Her Majesty the Queen may from time to time by Order in Council direct shall be taken and accepted for Sees of Bishops Suffragans as if they had been included in that Act, and that that Act shall be construed and have effect accordingly:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, under and by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, and all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct, and doth hereby direct, that the Town of which the name is scheduled to this Order shall be taken and accepted for a See of a Bishop Suffragan as if it had been included in the above-

mentioned Act of the 26th year of the reign of King Henry the Eighth, Chapter 14.
