Subject to the exceptions provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

BIRMINGHAM CITY COUNCIL

The City of Birmingham (Traffic Regulation) (No. 45) Order, 1967
