

HUDDERSFIELD COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Huddersfield (Carr Pit Road) (Experimental Traffic Regulation) Order, 1968

Notice is hereby given that the Huddersfield County Borough Council propose to make an Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 the effect of which will be to prevent persons except upon the direction of a police constable in uniform:

- (a) from driving or causing or permitting to be driven any vehicle on the length of road specified in the first column of the First Schedule hereto otherwise than in the direction specified opposite to that length in the second column of the said Schedule
- (b) from causing or permitting any vehicle to wait on any weekday in any length of road specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

Exceptions (in relation to the part of the Order referred to at (b) above) will be provided to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road and the services therein, or to enable a vehicle to be used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of its statutory powers or duties.

The Order if made, will be in force for a period of three months or for such further period as may be specified in a direction given by the Minister of Transport.

Objections to the proposals must be sent in writing to the undersigned by the 15th May 1968.

KEIGHLEY BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Keighley (Alice Street) (Restriction of Waiting) Order No. 10, 1968

Notice is hereby given that the Keighley Borough Council propose to make an Order in exercise of their powers under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, the effect of which will be to:

- (1) restrict the waiting by vehicles to a period of not longer than one hour in any two between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on weekdays in the length of Alice Street specified in the Schedule hereto;
- (2) exempt from the above-mentioned restriction the waiting by a vehicle to enable it to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road, or the services therein.

3. Objections to the proposal, together with the grounds on which they are made, must be sent in writing to the undersigned by the 27th May 1968.

KENT COUNTY COUNCIL

The County Council of Kent (Carlton Avenue, Stone) (Width Restriction) Order, 1967
