The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

1. an Order under sections 7 and 44 of the above Act providing—

(a) that a road which he proposes to construct at Green Brough in the County of York, North Riding, shall become a trunk road as from the date when the Order comes into operation, and

(b) that the length of the Penrith-Middlesbrough Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the County Council of York, North Riding (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the new trunk road is open for through traffic; and

2. an Order under section 9 of the above Act authorising the Minister—

(a) to carry out improvements to the Newsham Road (114/9);

(b) to stop up highways; and

(c) to construct a new highway to connect the Newsham Road (114/9) with the above-mentioned new trunk road, all at Green Brough aforesaid,

The M.56 North Cheshire Motorway (Wythenshawe-Bowdon Section Side Roads) Order 1968

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that, in relation to the part of the M.56 North Cheshire Motorway which will be situated between Wythenshawe in the City and County Borough of Manchester, and Bowdon in the County of Chester, he has made an Order under section 13 of the above Act, the effect of which is—

- (a) to authorise the Minister—

(i) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;

(ii) to stop up highways;

(iii) to construct new highways;

(iv) to stop up private means of access to premises; and

(v) to provide new means of access to premises,

all on or in the vicinity of the route of the above-mentioned part of the said motorway, and

- (b) to provide for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the highway authority specified therefor in the Order as from the 1st April next

after the date on which the Minister notifies that authority that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.
