This Order which comes into operation on 28th May 1968 prescribes the form of the report of the result of every thorough examination of a hoist or lift required to be made by Regulation 6(1) of the Offices, Shops and Railway Premises (Hoists and Lifts) Regulations 1968.

### SPECIAL REGULATIONS

*Offices, Shops and Railway Premises Act, 1963*

*The Offices, Shops and Railway Premises (Hoists and Lifts) Regulations 1968*

The First Secretary of State and the Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity hereby gives notice that on 27th May 1968, she made the Offices, Shops, and Railway Premises (Hoists and Lifts) Regulations 1968 which come into operation on 28th May 1969. These Regulations impose requirements as to the construction, maintenance and examination of hoists and lifts in offices, shops and railway premises. They also require liftways to be enclosed and the provision of gates fitted with devices for securing that the gates cannot be opened unless a lift is at the landing and that a lift cannot be moved away from the landing until the gates are closed. They also require that every lift shall be marked with its maximum safe working load. The Regulations exempt from certain requirements certain lifts and hoists subject to specified conditions and limitations.

## WAGES COUNCIL

### WAGES COUNCILS ACT 1959

*Sack and Bag Wages Council (Great Britain)*

The Sack and Bag Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity proposals for (1) varying the provisions relating to statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Wages Regulation (Sack and Bag) Order 1967 (Order S.B.(63)); (2) amending the provisions relating to holidays and holiday remuneration set out in the Wages Regulation (Sack and Bag) (Holidays) Order 1963 (Order S.B.(57)); and (3) the revocation of Order S.B.(63) and Order S.B.(57).

Particulars of the proposals are contained in the Wages Council's Notice S.B.(64) which may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above-mentioned proposals if made to it within 14 days from 11th June 1968. Any such representation should bear the writer's address and signature and be sent to the Secretary, Sack and Bag Wages Council (Great Britain), Ebury Bridge House, Ebury Bridge Road, London S.W.1. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections, and quote the number of the Wages Council's Notice of proposals S.B.(64).
