ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

Extension of 30 m.p.h. Speed Limit-Dover

That length of the London-Folkestone-Dover Trunk Road (A.20), known as Folkestone Road, at Maxton in the Borough of Dover which extends from the south-west terminal of the existing speed limit for 283 yards.

The Trunk Road (Mandale Road and Middlesbrough Road, Thornaby-on-Tees) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1968.

The Minister of Transport has made an Order under sections 1 and 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 the effect of which is to extend the waiting restrictions already in force in that length of the Penrith—Middlesbrough Trunk Road (A.67) known as Mandale Road in the Borough of Thornaby-on-Tees so that they now apply at all times in those lengths of the trunk road specified in the Schedule herety. hereto.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein.
