General Oskai, one of the Leaders of the Malecontents, has submitted himself and his whole Regiment to the Emperor; Count Palfi, Ban of Croaria, having procur'd him Table Eniperor's Pardon. He has likewife deliver'd up a were Masters of, and which continueds a Pass leaving to First of the Towns of Upper Hungary that lye among the Mountains.
