

From the Camp at Launoy, September 20. N. S. On Tuesday the 18th the Army commanded by his Grace the Duke of Marlborough decamp'd from Sainghin, and having repais'd the Marque at Pont a Treflin and Forest, came and encamp'd with the Right at Willem, the Left at Pas a Vafne, and the Head-Quarters at Templeuve. His Grace was inform'd, upon the March, that the Enemy having extended their Line from Tournay towards Audenarde, had laid Bridges over the Schelde, between Warcoin and Pccoq, and were fortifying those Villages, in order to keep a Communication with this side of the River, and disturb our Convoys between Audenarde and Courtray; Lieutenant-General Dedem was whereupon order'd to march Yesterday at break of Day, with all the Granadiers of the Army, and 36 Field-Pieces, to dislodge them; and, upon the first Appearance of our advanc'd Guard of 200 Men, the Enemy retir'd, and took up their Bridges; whereupon our Men return'd to the Camp. This Day our Army made a small Movement, and is now encamp'd with the Right at Forest, and the Left at Leers. His Grace has an Account, that Major-General Murray is arriv'd at Brussels with 4 Battalions from Flanders, 6 Squadrons of Imperial Horse and Hussars, which were coming from Germany to join the Prince of Savoy's Army, are likewise stop'd there, and put under the Command of Lieutenant-General Pascal, Governor of that Place. The Enemy continue encamp'd between Tournay and Audenarde; and we hear Monsieur de la Motte having repais'd the Dender, is retir'd with his Detachment towards Ghent.

Brussels, Sept. 19. N. S. Yesterday, about six in the Morning, a strong Detachment of the French Horse appear'd on the Hills near Vilvorde, from whence some Workmen were order'd to break the Sluce upon the Canal of this Place over-against the three Fountains, which being executed, the Enemy retir'd. All the Troops in the Town were order'd to their Arms, and by the great care of our Commander in chief the Out-posts were so well secur'd, that the Enemy did not think fit to approach. This Night the Garrison will be reinforc'd by 4 Battalions from Dutch Flanders, under Major-General Murray, and a considerable Body of Hussars and Imperial Dragoons, lately arriv'd from Germany.

Hague, Sept. 21. N. S. The Queen of Portugal is detain'd by contrary Winds, and continues at the Brille with her Court on board the Yachts. The Officers of his Imperial Majesty, who attended the Queen to this Place, set out from hence yesterday, in order to return to Vienna.

Offend, Sept. 23. N. S. Letters from the Army say, that on the 21st at Night the Outworks of Lifle were attack'd, and an Hornwork, with other Works, taken after an obstinate Dispute, which lasted four Hours. Monsieur la Motte, who was advanc'd towards Brussels with a Body of Men, with design, as is believ'd, to surprize that Place, as come back to Bruges, upon Advice that the Troops under the Command of Lieutenant-General Earle were arriv'd here.

Whitehaven, Sept. 8. This Day arriv'd the Hannah Maria of this Port, Joseph Manesty Commander, in 9 Weeks and 3 Days from Jamaica, in Company with the Dorothy of London, of 18 Guns; the Maxfield-Galley of London, of 12 Guns, Captain Shaddock Commander; the Amy-Galley of London, of 24 Guns, Captain Prince Commander; the Betty-Pink of Biddiford; the four last went through the windward Passage. The Commander of the Hannah Maria says, he left the Country very healthy; that he met Commodore Wager as he was sailing from Bluefields to Port Royal, with about 13 Sail; and that he saw the Betty-Galley of Bristol on the Banks of Newfoundland about the 16th of August, having taken three Prizes, and was bound for the Straits.

Windser, Sept. 12. This Day her Majesty was pleas'd to Confer, as a particular Mark of her Favour, the Honour of Knighthood on Peter King, Esq; Recorder of the City of London.
