On Saturday, 2nd November 1968, at 2200 hours, Major Skelton, Second in Command of the Depot and Training Battalion, Army Catering Corps, was sitting in his residence at 5 Boxalls Lane, Aldershot, sitting in his residence at 5 Boxalis Lane, Aldershot, when he heard a woman's scream. He went to the front door and down his garden path when he heard another scream from an unlit footpath almost opposite his house. He ran across to the entrance of the footpath where he saw a well built young man, armed with a large dagger, assaulting a girl. He immediately closed with the man, with complete disregard for his own personal safety, knowing that the girl's assailant was armed. As he did so, he was struck a blow with the dagger on the left side of his chest, the dagger was armed. As he did so, he was struck a blow with the dagger on the left side of his chest, the dagger entering the chest through the ribs. Despite his severe wound he continued to close with the assailant and was struck a second blow in the chest. However he held on to the assailant, wrestled with him, brought him to the ground and at the same time shouted instructions to the girl to run away as fast as she could. This she managed to do reached the entrance him to the ground and at the same time shouted instructions to the girl to run away as fast as she could. This she managed to do, reached the entrance to the lane and ran to the first house in the road for assistance. Despite the acute pain from his wounds, Major Skelton prevented the assailant pursuing the girl and managed to put his foot on the assailant's stomach and threw him over his head, hoping to dislodge the grip on the knife. He also shouted for assistance and for someone to call the police. The man managed to break free and ran from the entrance of the footpath up Boxalls Lane. A Major of the Royal Army Veterinary Corps, who had also heard the shouts and screams appeared on the scene and attempted to close with the man and was stabbed in the lower back, and the man ran off.

The Police were quickly on the scene and an ambulance sent for. The girl who the man had stabbed, attempted to ravish and strangle, together with Major Skelton and the Royal Army Veterinary Corps Major were taken to the Cambridge Military Hospital, Aldershot. An emergency operation was performed on Major Skelton in the early hours of Sunday morning.

There is no doubt that the brave and gallant actions of Major Skelton, who with complete disregard for his own personal safety, faced a determined armed
