HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959—COUNTRYSIDE ACT, 1968

Northampton Rural District Council, Quinton No. 1 Public Path Diversion Order 1969

Notice is hereby given that the above Order made on the 29th day of January 1969 is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation, or to be confirmed by the Northampton Rural District Council, as an unopposed Order.
