Seaford (Footpaths 45(a) and 45(b)) Public Path Diversion Order, 1969

Notice is hereby given that the above Order made on 17th February 1969, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Seaford Urban District Council as an unopposed Order.
