That Evening the Gates of the City were thur up and well guarded, and the Nobility took their Oaths of Fidelity, to the New King Christian the V. who the next day figned feveral dispatches as King, and received the Compliments of the City. The Body of the deceased King, is exposed upon a Bed of State in the Castle.
