PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

REMUNERATION OF SOLICITORS

Instruction under section 3 (2) to the National Board for Prices and Incomes

1. The Government have accepted proposals made by the National Board for Prices and Incomes in their Report on the Remuneration of Solicitors

(Report No. 54, Cmnd. 3529), relating to alterations in charges and the keeping of solicitors' remuneration under continuous review by the Board.

2. All relevant factors affecting the professional earnings of solicitors will be within the scope of the review, so that the Board's recommendations may help to ensure that the scales prescribed by the Statutory Committees are consistent with the Government's prices and incomes policy.

3. For this purpose the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity has made an Order (The Prices and Incomes (Continuous Review) (No. 1) Order 1969, S.I. 1969/299) under section 3 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 applying section 3 of that Act to solicitors' remuneration.

4. In pursuance of the said Order and in exercise of their powers under section 3 (2) of the said Act, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Lord Chancellor acting jointly hereby instruct the National Board for Prices and Incomes to keep the remuneration of solicitors under continuous review. As part of its report, the Board will in the first instance investigate and report on all changes in the revenue, expenses and profits of solicitors since the period covered by the Board's previous Report and the effect, if any, of such changes on the recommendations contained in that Report.

PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

WAGES AND CONDITIONS IN THE ELECTRICAL CONTRACTING INDUSTRY

Direction under section 5 (4) extending the period within which the National Board for Prices and Incomes must publish their report.

1. Whereas the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, in pursuance of her powers under section 2 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, referred the above mentioned question to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and has published the text of the reference in the Gazette on 13th December 1968;

2. And whereas by section 5 (3) of the Act, but subject to section 5 (4), the Board are required to
