

3. To give the Board power to raise up to £500,000 on overdraft or other temporary loan in addition to its former power to raise money by the issue of debenture stock. (The amount which the Board can borrow under its former power is, however, reduced by £500,000 under the terms of the Order.)

4. To enable the Board to remunerate and pay the expenses of its members.

A copy of the draft Order which accompanied the application may be seen at all reasonable hours at the office of the Board, Harbour House, Dover.

CIVIC AMENITIES ACT 1967

Conservation Area at Knaresborough

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire as Local Planning Authority after consultation with the Knaresborough Urban District Council have designated the area referred to in the Schedule to this notice as a Conservation Area in accordance with section 1 of the Civic Amenities Act 1967. The area is one which the County Council consider to be an area of special architectural or historic interest the character or appearance of which should be preserved or enhanced, and will be the subject of stringent control of development. The County Council intend to take such action as may be available to them to secure the preservation of the character and the general improvement of the area.

The Conservation Area is defined on a plan which may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours at the office of the County Planning Officer, Raines House, Denby Dale Road, Wakefield, at the office of the Area Planning Officer, Salisbury Buildings, Albert Street, Harrogate, or at the office of the Clerk to Knaresborough Urban District Council, Knaresborough House, High Street, Knaresborough.

THE SCHEDULE

Knaresborough Urban District

The Conservation Area includes the whole of the central shopping area of Knaresborough and a major part of the Nidd Valley through the town. The northernmost part of the Conservation Area includes Collins Bank Landing Stage and the boundary follows the eastern boundary of fields Nos. 4163 and 4038 to include Conyngnam Hall and Knaresborough Zoo turning eastwards to include premises on the northern side of Bond End (A.59). The Conservation Area includes premises on the east side of the junction of High Street with Boroughbridge Road and the boundary follows the north-eastern boundary of premises fronting High Street including premises in Whiteley Yard, Commercial Yard, Park Square, Park Place, Anchor Yard and Park Row. The boundary then runs from Park Row along the eastern boundary of premises on the east side of the junction of Park Row and York Place, along York Place, Iles Lane and the western boundary of premises in Stockdale Walk, skirting the western boundary of Low Bridge Quarry to Briggate and along Briggate to Low Bridge. The Conservation Area includes Mother Shiptons Public House and the boundary then follows the southern boundary of field No. 6649, and the western boundaries of fields Nos. 6268 and 7000 crossing the railway to follow the line of the access road to Dropping Well Farm as far as Harrogate Road. The Conservation Area includes The George Public House and then follows the south-western boundaries of fields Nos. 4509, 3414, 1920 and the western boundary of Foolish Wood and field No. 2655 to the River Nidd.
