There is to be no increase in the quantity of water authorised to be abstracted by licence No. 9/40/6/20/SR and the variation to permit the abstraction of water from the Royal Military Canal for use on the additional land is for the 1969 season only and will expire on the 31st July 1969.

## PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AND CLEAN AIR ACT

### ACCRINGTON BOROUGH COUNCIL

*The Borough of Accrington (No. 9) Smoke Control Order, 1969*

Notice is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Accrington in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act, 1956, on the 6th March 1969, made the above-mentioned Smoke Control Order, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the limitations and exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable

to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before the 1st November 1970, or before such later date as may be determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at my offices in the Town Hall, Accrington, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 22nd March 1969.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to The Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

### SCHEDULE

The area is delineated on the north-westerly side by the borough boundary from Shorten Wood to its junction with the mineral railway; along the mineral railway in an easterly direction to its junction with the Blackburn to Burnley British Railways main line, thence in a south-westerly direction along the railway line to its junction with Penny House Lane at Queens Road Bridge. In the south the line follows Penny House Lane to its junction with Burnley Road; north-easterly along the centre of Burnley Road to its junction with Durham Street; south-easterly along Durham Street to its junction with Peel Park football ground and thence around the boundary of the football ground in a north-easterly and then south-easterly direction to its junction with Turkey Street; north-easterly along Turkey Street, through the junction with Peel Park Avenue and then continuing along the public footpath turning south and then east to the junction with Kings Highway; thence north and east along Kings Highway to the junction with a track at the north-west point of Huncoat Quarry; easterly along the track and then north-easterly along the boundaries of three fields to the borough boundary. In the east the line follows the borough boundary in a northerly direction to the British Railways main line and then in a north-westerly direction to Shorten Wood.
