

PRIVY COUNCIL OFFICE

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 18th day of March 1969.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Minister of Housing and Local Government that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in the Old Churchyard, Wooburn, in the County of Buckingham, shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto, has in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 22nd day of November 1968, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853 (1853 c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Old Churchyard, Wooburn, in the County of Buckingham, shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that—

- (1) in earthen graves now existing in the said Churchyard the burial may be allowed at their decease of the bodies of Phoebe Lillice Lane and Margaret Hinton;
- (2) in the Bailey family grave in the said Churchyard the burial may be allowed at their decease of the bodies of any two members of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave;

Subject in each case to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Old Churchyard, Wooburn, Buckinghamshire) Order 1969.
