- (c) the footpath No. 2 running from the Preston Bissett to Barton Hartshorne Road from a point 266 yards north-west of The Manor Drive entrance in a southerly direction for 260 yards to its junction with an existing footpath at a point where it crosses The Manor Drive to a line running from The Manor Drive entrance on the Preston Bissett to Barton Hartshorne road in a south-westerly direction and following the Drive for a distance of 240 yards to its junction with the existing Preston Bissett to Barton Hartshorne footpath.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at Council Offices, School Lane, Buckingham, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday.

The Order becomes operative as from 28th March 1969, and if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within six weeks from 28th March 1969, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
