

SOUTHEND-ON-SEA COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

County Borough of Southend-on-Sea (Manchester Drive)(Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1969

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the County Borough of Southend-on-Sea propose to make an Order under Sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles as follows:

<i>Length of Road</i>	<i>Side of Road</i>	<i>Hours of Prohibition</i>
<i>Manchester Drive.</i> From a point 10 yards south-east of its junction with Darlington Grove to a point 10 yards west of its junction with Norfolk Avenue.	South	24 hours daily
<i>Manchester Drive.</i> From a point 10 yards east of its junction with Norfolk Avenue to a point 10 yards west of that junction.	North	24 hours daily
<i>Manchester Drive.</i> From a point 10 yards east of its junction with Middlesex Avenue to a point 10 yards west of that junction.	North	24 hours daily
<i>Norfolk Avenue.</i> From its junction with Manchester Drive northwards for a distance of 10 yards.	Both	24 hours daily
<i>Middlesex Avenue.</i> From its junction with Manchester Drive northwards for a distance of 10 yards.	Both	24 hours daily
<i>Pavilion Drive.</i> From its junction with Manchester Drive southwards for a distance of 10 yards.	Both	24 hours daily
<i>Darlington Grove.</i> From its junction with Manchester Drive southwards for a distance of 10 yards.	Both	24 hours daily

Exceptions will be provided in the above Order to enable a vehicle to wait for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any funeral, building operation or demolition, the removal of furniture or of any obstruction to traffic the maintenance of the road or the services therein.

A copy of the proposed Order and a map showing the roads to which the proposed Order relates may be inspected at my office at the Civic Centre, Victoria Avenue, Southend-on-Sea during normal office hours.

Objections to the proposals together with the grounds on which they are made must be sent in writing to the undersigned by the 16th May 1969.

EAST SUFFOLK COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

(The Borough of Southwold) (East Street, Ferry Road, High Street, Lorne Road, Market Place, Mill Lane, Pinkneys Lane, Queen Street, Queens Road, South Green, Trinity Street) (Traffic Regulation) Order, 1969.

Notice is hereby given that the East Suffolk County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, the effect of which will be:

- To impose a system of one way traffic control in the lengths of road specified in the First Schedule hereto.
- To prohibit waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily in the lengths of road specified in the Second Schedule hereto.
- To restrict the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. to 30 minutes Monday to Saturday inclusive in the lengths of road specified in the Third Schedule hereto.
- To revoke the provisions as contained in the existing Traffic Regulation Order which provisions refer to the lengths of road contained in the proposed Order.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait in any lengths of the road where the No Waiting and Limited Waiting Restrictions apply, for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight, to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded, and to enable it to be used in connection with any funeral, or building etc. operations.

A copy of the Order and relevant plan is available for inspection during normal office hours at the

Borough Council Offices, Town Hall, Southwold, or the County Hall, Ipswich.

FIRST SCHEDULE

In the Borough of Southwold (One Way Traffic Regulation)

<i>Length of Road</i>	<i>Direction of Flow</i>
<i>East Street</i> from a point at its junction with Market Place to a point at its junction with Pinkneys Lane.	In a south-easterly direction.
<i>Pinkneys Lane</i> from a point at its junction with East Street to a point at its junction with Queen Street.	In a South-westerly direction.

SECOND SCHEDULE

In the Borough of Southwold (No Waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. daily)

- East Street*
- On the north-east side from a point at its junction with the Market Place to a point at its junction with Trinity Street.
 - On the south-west side from a point at its junction with the Market Place to a point opposite the western boundary of No. 2 East Street.
 - The vehicular access on the south-western side between Nos. 5 and 7 East Street.
 - The vehicular access on the south-west side between No. 9 and East Lodge, East Street.
 - On the south-west side from a point at its junction with Pinkneys Lane to a point opposite the western boundary of No. 30 East Street.

Perry Road. On both sides from a point opposite the north-western boundary wall of Stone House in a southerly direction to a point opposite the south-eastern boundary of "Morning Side".
