North Cotswold Rural District Council (No. 1 Chipping Campden) Public Path Diversion Order, 1969.

Notice is hereby given that on the 6th May 1969, the North Cotswold Rural District Council confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert part of the public right of way from a point on the south side of Kingcombe Lane, approximately 423 yards north-east of the junction of the Weston Subedge to Chipping Campden Road, running for a distance of 372 yards to a line running from a point on the south side of Kingcombe Lane, approximately 620 yards north-east of the junction of the West Subedge to Chipping Campden Road to a point running in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 257 yards and joining the existing public footpath. The section of path to be diverted will be closed as from 10th June 1969.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Morton-in-Marsh between the hours of 9 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. from Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

The Order becomes operative as from the 9th day of May 1969, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.
