- (c) To enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction of traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the length of road so referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878;
- (d) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said length or road;
- (e) to enable the vehicle, if it is a fire engine, or ambulance or a vehicle in the service of a police force, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (f) to enable the vehicle to be used as part of a funeral cortege or otherwise in connection with a funeral; or
- (g) to enable the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953.

The Order will come into operation on the 1st day of June, 1969.
