WEST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

Revocation of Planning Permission (Upper Lodge Farm, Braybrooke) Order, 1969

Whereas on the 19th September 1968, the Kettering Rural District Council acting in exercise of functions delegated to them by the County Council of the Administrative County of Northampton (hereinafter referred to as "the County Council") granted permission under Part III of the Town and Country Planning Act 1947 for the erection of a farmhouse at Upper Lodge Farm, Braybrooke, and forming part of parcel Nos. 25 and 134 on the Ordnance Survey Map (1926 Edition) for the said Parish (hereinafter referred to as "the said land")

And whereas no part of the development permitted by the said planning permission has been carried out

And whereas the County Council as the local planning authority under the Town and Country Planning Act 1962 consider it expedient to revoke the said planning permission having given permission for similar development upon an alternative site

And whereas the County Council have made an Order under section 27 of the said Act of 1962 that the said planning permission dated the 19th September 1968 be revoked

Now therefore the County Council hereby give notice:

- (1) That any owner or occupier of the said land or any other person affected by the said Order may on or before the 30th June 1969 give notice to the Minister of Housing and Local Government that he wishes for an opportunity of appearing before, and being heard by, a person appointed by the Minister for the purpose (any such notice shall be addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1).
- (2) That if no such notice is given to the Minister by the date specified in paragraph (1) the said Order will take effect without being confirmed by the Minister at the expiration of a period of 14 days from that date by virtue of section 80 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1968.
- (3) That no compensation under section 118 of the Act of 1962 will be payable in respect of the said Order if it takes effect by virtue of the said section 80 and without being confirmed by the Minister.
