*Mangotsfield Urban District Council (Charnhill)**Extinguishment of Public Right of Way Order, 1969*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on the 19th day of May 1969 is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order by the Mangotsfield Urban District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish the public right of way running from Mangotsfield Road in a southerly direction across Charnhill to the Urban District boundary.

The Mangotsfield Urban District Council is satisfied that a suitable alternative right of way has been provided through Charnhill Drive.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, South View, Staple Hill, Bristol, on weekdays (excluding Saturdays) from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.

If you wish to have sent to you in due course a notice to the effect that the Order has been confirmed and a copy of the Order as confirmed you should write to the Clerk of the Council, giving your name and the address to which those documents may be sent.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Clerk of the Council, Mangotsfield Urban District Council, Council Offices, South View, Staple Hill, before 23rd day of June 1969, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representation or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn the Mangotsfield Urban District Council can, instead of submitting the Order to the Ministry of Housing and Local Government, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

Extinguishment Order 1969*

Path Diversion Order, 1969*
