

The Lord Marshal's ORDER.

IN Pursuance of an Order of the Right Honourable the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy-Council, appointed a Committee to consider of the Interment of his Royal Highness Prince George of Denmark, dated the First of November, 1708. This is to give Publick Notice; That it is expected that all Persons, on this Occasion, do put themselves into the deepest Mourning (long Cloaks excepted) on Sunday the 7th Instant; And that as well all Lords as Privy-Councillors, and Officers of Her Majesty's and his Royal Highness's Household, do Cover their Coaches and Chariots; and Chairs; and Cloath their Livery-Servants, with Black Cloth, by Sunday the 14th of this Month; And that no Person do use any Varnish'd or Bullion Nails to be seen on their Coaches; Chariots, or their Chairs.
