*The Borough of Yeovil (Parking Places) (No. 3) Order 1969*

##### *Bus Station Car Park*

Notice is hereby given that on the 6th day of August 1969, the Yeovil Borough Council made an Order under section 31 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, the effect of which is to:

- (1) authorise the Bus Station Car Park, Earle Street, as an off-street parking place for the classes of vehicles set out in the Order subject to right of the Council to suspend its use at any time;
- (2) empower the Council to remove from the parking place vehicles left there in breach of certain provisions of the Order;
- (3) regulate the use of the parking place, and in particular to prohibit vehicles being left for longer than 72 hours;
- (4) impose charges for parking between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. daily (excluding Sundays) on the following scale:

6d. for the first hour and 1s. 0d. for each subsequent hour, subject to a maximum charge of 10s. 0d. in any one day (such charges to be prepaid through a ticket issuing machine) with an excess charge of 10s. 0d. (payable direct to the Borough Treasurer within 14 days) where appropriate tickets are not displayed on a vehicle.

The Order becomes operative on the 2nd September 1969, and a copy together with the relevant map can be inspected during normal office hours at Municipal Offices, King George Street, Yeovil.

## TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS

*The Borough of Hyde (Diversion of Footpath) (No. 1) Order, 1969*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), made on the 4th day of August 1969, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation or to be confirmed by Hyde Borough Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way running from the north-easterly end of the boundary fence to the premises of I.C.I. Limited, and continuing for a distance of 105 feet in a north-easterly direction then for a further 735 feet in a north-easterly direction towards Yew Tree Lane to a line running from the north-easterly end of the boundary fence and proceeding in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 805 feet towards Yew Tree Lane.

If no representations or objections are duly made or if any so made are withdrawn, the Hyde Borough Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Minister for confirmation, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Minister with the Order.
