CIVIC AMENITIES ACTS

HUNTINGDON AND PETERBOROUGH COUNTY COUNCIL

CIVIC AMENITIES ACT 1967

Notice is hereby given that under Part I of the Civic Amenities Act, the Huntingdon and Peterborough County Council has designated two further Conservation Areas. They are as follows:

(i) *Conservation Area No. 4—Castor*

This comprises almost the whole of the built-up area of the village and is centred on the Parish Church. Starting in the east the boundary follows for a distance the south-west edge of Ordnance Survey field number 234, crosses Water Lane and passes in a north-westerly direction to reach the south-east corner of The Rectory grounds. From here it follows the irregular line of the curtilages of the older properties in High Street and Church Hill, continuing westward to cross Clay Lane and

follows the southern boundary of Ordnance Survey field number 252.

From here the boundary continues westwards and eventually turns south along the western boundary of Manor Farm to reach the Peterborough Road. It then follows the line of this road to The Green where it passes eastwards to the rear of the curtilages of all properties on the south of Peterborough Road. After crossing Splash Lane the boundary continues until it reaches the Peterborough Road at Love's Hill, continuing along this until it reaches the south-eastern corner of the grounds of Castor House.

(ii) *Conservation Area No. 5—Ailsworth*

This comprises the whole of the older part of the village. Starting at the south-western corner of the village on the Peterborough Road the boundary follows the western boundary of the village northwards as far as the north-western corner of Ordnance Survey field number 45. Turning eastwards along the northern limit of Main Street and thence to the Helpston Road which it follows southwards as far as the electricity sub-station. The boundary then follows the eastern boundary of the properties on Helpston Road, and continues southwards to cross the Peterborough Road and turns westwards along the southern boundaries of the properties on this road as far as Station Road, thence westwards to the south-western corner of the village.

Plans showing these areas are available for inspection at the offices of the County Planning Office, Walden House, Huntingdon.
