Notice is hereby given that the Canterbury City Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act 1956 on the 9th day of September 1969, made an Order entitled the City of Canterbury (Downs Road) (No. 1) Smoke Control Order 1969 declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

By virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before the 1st day of September 1970, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.
