ALDERSHOT BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Aldershot (Vine Street, Lysons Road and Upper Elms Road) (Prohibition of Waiting)
Order, 1969.

Notice is hereby given that the Borough Council propose to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle twenty-four hours a day on any day of the week (except Sunday) in any of the lengths of road specified in the Schedule hereto.

The Borough of Aldershot (Queens Road and York Road) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1969

Notice is hereby given that the Borough Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 the effect of which will be:

- (1) To revoke "the Borough of Aldershot (Perowne Street) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1967", which prohibits the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. in certain lengths of Perowne Street, so far as that Order relates to the lengths of Perowne Street specified in the Schedule hereto.
