Wallingford Rural District Council (Footpath No. 4 at Aston Tirrold) Public Path Diversion Order, 1969.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on the 29th day of July 1969 is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Wallingford Rural District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the public right of way running in a general easterly direction from the track between "The Bungalow", and "Silverburn", The Croft, Aston Tirrold, to the footbridge across Cholley Brook at the south-east corner of The Lees, on the boundary of the Parishes of Aston Tirrold and Cholley, to a line running from The Croft to and along existing and new watercourses to the some footbridge partly to the east and partly to the west of the line of the existing path.

The Wiltshire County Council (Footpath No. 2 (Part) Parish of Figheldean) Public Path Diversion Order, 1969

Notice is hereby given that on the 18th September 1969, the Wiltshire County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed is to divert the length of Footpath No. 2 at Figheldean running from the end of the unmade road known as Council Lane in a general south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 370 yards to its junction with Footpath No. 1, on to a new route running

from the Figheldean to Ablington road on the north-west side of the entrance to the site of Ablington House and leading in a general north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 175 yards to join Footpath No. 1.

The Order becomes operative as from the 2nd October 1969, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within six weeks from Friday, 3rd October 1969, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

Declaration of Dedication of Extension to the Witham Urban District Council (Guithavon Valley) Footpath No. 87.
