REPORT BY THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR PRICES AND INCOMES

#### *Pay of Pilots Employed by the British Overseas Airways Corporation*

On 5th June 1969, in pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Board of Trade referred to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and report:

- (a) the question of the productivity implications of the agreement reached between British Overseas Airways Corporation and the British Air Line Pilots' Association on 5th April and the extent to which increased productivity and savings will offset increased costs; and
- (b) the implications of the agreement for future negotiations between the Corporation and the Association with particular reference to a reduction in the number of pilots in certain aircraft crews from three to two and the pay and conditions of employment of pilots who are to fly the Boeing 747.
