

Cowes, December 12. On the 10th Instant was forced in at the Needles a French Banker from Newfoundland, about 150 Tons, 8 Guns, and 35 Men, which came to an Anchor off of Newtown, and was there taken by Her Majesty's Isle of Wight Yacht.

The Right Honourable Thomas Earl of Pembroke and Montgomery, &c.
