CIVIC AMENITIES ACT 1967

*Conservation Areas Nos. 1, 2 and 3
Borough of Bedford*

Notice is hereby given that the Bedfordshire County Council have designated as Conservation Areas in accordance with the provisions of section 1 of the Civic Amenities Act 1967, three areas in the centre of the Borough of Bedford, more particularly described hereunder:

Area No. 1 is broadly defined in the north by Silver Street, Mill Street and the southern part of St. Cuthberts Street, extends southwards along Newnham Road across the River Great Ouse to include the Dame Alice Harpur School site and part of Cardington Road, but excluding an area in the vicinity of Bedesman Place, northwards along St. Mary's Street and westwards to Prebend Street Bridge including the river frontage, thence along the northern river frontage to the Brewery and northwards through the Bedford Modern School site to Midland Road/Silver Street.

Area No. 2 covers an area in the northwest of the town centre including St. Peter's Green, St. Peter's Street, part of the west side of Kimbolton Road and the northern part of St. Cuthbert's Street and a further area covering The Grove.

Area No. 3 lies between Bromham Road and Tavistock Street and includes The Crescent and Adelaide Square, and Priory Terrace on the south side of Bromham Road.

A map showing these three Conservation Areas may be inspected at the offices of the Bedfordshire County Council situated at the County Records Office, Library and Records Block, County Hall, Cauldwell Street, Bedford during office hours.

Conservation Areas

Notice is hereby given that the County Council in pursuance of their powers under section 1 of the Civic Amenities Act 1967, have designated as Conservation Areas those parts of the following places as described below:

Earls Colne—The area includes all properties fronting A.604 from Colne Green Farm in the west to the Station Road junction with Colchester Road in the east (High Street, Church Hill, Holt Street, Lower Holt Street, Bridge Street and Colchester Road) and all properties fronting Back Lane, part of Hayhouse Road, part Burrows Road, part Queens Road, Park Lane, York Road, Shut Lane, part Tey Road and part Colne Park Road. Views to north-west and south-east from Colneford Bridge in Bridge Street.

Ingatestone—The area includes all properties fronting the High Street, from a point in the north, approximately 30 yards south of Park Drive. It extends south to the Post Office, including Clifton Terrace, Margarets Cottages, part Stock Lane, Bakers Lane, Market Place, Star Lane, part Norton Road and part Post Office Road.

*Sible Hedingham**Area 1*

The area includes Prayers Farm, St. Peter's Church and Greys Hall and south to include all properties fronting Church Street, Cresswell Farm, The Rectory and properties opposite it and part of School Road.

Area 2

The area includes properties fronting part of Swan Street, Alderford Street, Alderford Mill, Potter Street and Queen Street to Braintree Corner.
