

R.M. other ranks who die while serving on full pay on or after 31st March 1969.

(b) All awards under this section will be governed by the general conditions set out in section III as applicable.

23. Where a permanent Officer or a short service Officer dies while serving on full pay on the Active List, his widow may be granted a gratuity as follows:—

(i) If, had the Officer been invalided, he would have been eligible for a terminal grant, a gratuity equal to nine-tenths of the terminal grant to which he would have been entitled had he been invalided on the day of his death.

(ii) In other cases a gratuity on the following scale for each year which would have been counted for service gratuity as an Officer.

4 years' service ...	475
5 years' service ...	585
6 years' service ...	695
7 years' service ...	810
8 years' service ...	935
9 years' service ...	1,060

Thence by increments of £125 for each additional year of service which would have been counted for service gratuity.

24. Where a R.N. rating or R.M. other rank dies while serving on full pay on a regular engagement his widow may be granted a gratuity as follows:—

(i) If, had he been invalided, he would have been eligible for a terminal grant, a gratuity equal to nine-tenths of the terminal grant to which he would have been entitled on the day of his death.

(ii) If, had he been invalided on the day he died, he was not eligible for a terminal grant, his widow may be paid a gratuity in accordance with the following scale:—

Thence by increments of £25 for each additional year of service which would have been counted for service gratuity.

25. Where, had the Officer or seaman or marine been invalided, an adjustment would have been made to his award in respect of gratuity, house purchase loan, or other non-effective payment previously received by him, an abatement may be made on that account in assessing the gratuity payable under Clause 23 or 24.

Whereas it is expedient to increase the scale of gratuities payable on discharge to locally entered ratings of the Goan Division of the Royal Navy:

Now therefore Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 11 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865 and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Goan Locally Entered Ratings and Ratings' Dependants' Service Gratuities) Order 1969.

2. In calculating gratuities payable to Goan locally entered ratings of the Royal Navy discharged on or after 29th February 1968 and to the dependants of such ratings who die while serving, the scales laid down by Order in Council (4 NPP) dated 12th July 1968 shall be increased by 30 per cent.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, the 5th December 1969, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1887, and the National Loans Act, 1968, to the amount of £120,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000 or £250,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 8th December 1969, to Friday, the 12th December 1969, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notifications will be sent, on the same day as Tenders are received, to the person whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payments in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

DEPARTMENT OF EMPLOYMENT AND PRODUCTIVITY

The Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity hereby gives notice that on 19th November 1969 she made the Fees of Appointed Factory Doctors Order 1969.

This Order determines, subject to any agreement between the appointed factory doctor and the occupier of a factory, the amount of fees payable by occupiers of factories to appointed factory doctors for various services required under the Factories Act 1961. It increases the fees fixed in 1968. The following Orders are revoked: S.I. 1968 No. 937, 1968 No. 1771 and 1969 No. 813.

PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

Reference to the National Board for Prices and Incomes of an arbitration award relating to payment for overtime worked by employees in the London Clearing Banks to whom the award applies.

The First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, acting in pursuance of her powers under section 2 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, hereby refers to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for their examination and report the award dated 19th September 1969 of the Arbitration Tribunal set up in accordance with the constitution and rules of the Joint Negotiating Council for Banking providing, amongst other things, with effect from 1st July 1969, that staff in the London Clearing Banks, other than of managerial status, shall be entitled to payment of overtime in respect of work carried out in excess of 7 hours per working day.
