Ut Viceroy Don Petro d' Arragon has been negotiating with the Merchants of this City for the return of 500 thouland Crowns to Milan and Flanders for the fervice of his Catholick Majefty, but as yet they are not come to any agreement.

He has for the prefent laid afide the thoughts of raifing Horle and Foot for the defence of that Kingdom againft the invations of the Turks, not feating any prelent danger on that fide.

Rome, Feb. 22. The Cardinal di Santa Crote having recovered his health returned on Sanday laft into the Conclave.

Cardinal Barberino as Dean, has ordered the Sacrament to be exposed in the Chappel of st. Paul within the Conclave, where the Devorions are hourly performed by the Conclavist, two of them affisting at a time, to beg a Bleffing upon the Election.

The Conclave has now continued 65 days, but the factions are to appearance for much difunited, and fo equally divided, that there is yet no appearance or any probability of a fpecty Election.

Cardinal Chigi is extreamly diffatisfy'd at the exclufion this Creature and Friend, the Cardinal d' Elei, who he luppoled might have had a greater Interest among the French, then to have merited to much feverity ; and endeavours to be fatisfy'd whether this exclusion proceeded from His most Ch. itian Maj fty or from the Artifices of the French Amballador the Duke de Chaulnes, and the Cardinals of the French faction.

On Tuefday last ended the diversions of the Carneval, during which, the Constable *Colonna* had wich great exp necentertained his Relations with Comedies, Feasts and Balls, with other diversions furable to the feasion, where were also frequently prefers the French Ambassiador, and divers of the Princes and principal Nobisty about the Town.

By a fpecial Command from the Cardinals, the chief of their refpective Orders, and the great Chamberlain of the Church, A fevere Proclamation is iffued out againft all Icandalous Libels and defanatory Pamphlets, and fuch performs who too frequently make it their buffnefs to fpread iafamous reports to the wounding of the reputation of other performs, e pecially thole of greater Eminency; as allo againft Players, common haunters of lewd Houfes, common Whores, and Women of different life paffing the Areets in Conches.

Dantzick, Feb 22. From Poland we see told, That the Bishop of Plotsko, who was sent by His Majelty, as one of His Amballadors, to meet the Queen, and to attend her to Czenstochow, is fallen ill by the way; and, that Patabiasky the Marshal of Lythuania, is joyned in Commission with the Chancellour of the same Province in his Room.

From Radzin in Lythuania, upon the Frontiers, between Polana and Moleowy, they Write, That the Commillioners from those Crowns have hot yet broken off their Treaty, but 'tis not believ'd that any good islue can be expected from it; the *Suufcovites* oppoing all Proposals tending to the Suurender of Kiow, unless the Poles will engage to deliver up to them 47 Places and Forts which the Collacks had taken from them. The lame Letters tell us, That Al. kins Alexiowigk; the eldeft Son of the Dear of Muscow, died on the 27th of Ianuary last at Moscow, to the great affliction of all that Empire.

Legarn, Feb. 24; Yesterday arrived the Huomo Buono, a ship off this place, in 12 dayes from Tripoli in Barbarz, scilling us, That the Corfuires of that place were all in Port; deveral of them returning snuch lamed and endammaged by the Engagement they had fome weeks before with the Dutch Copyroy which came from Smyr-

The Conferences between the Deputies from feveral of the Neighbouri, g Princes, about the Diffuers, between the King of Deumark and the Duke of Holftein Ploen, have had hitherto but little effect, the Danes being unwilling to quit the pofiesion of the County of Oldenberg, now under Diffue; the Duke being confident of the Juitne's of his Pretensions, is aveile from hearkning to any equivalent which fhall be proposed to him in lieu of it: But, the death of the late King of Denmark has put fome flop to that Affairs.

Letters of the 19th Inftant from Copenhagen, tell un, That the Affairs of that Kingdom are but little changed fince the Desth of the King, all Officers continuing their Employments as before, only Doctor Bullisk, Prefident of the City of Copenhagen, formerly the Kings Plyfitian, has refigned his Charge, which is fince conferred on Monfieur Finke.

The Famous Chevalier Borri, who, by fome finister Arts made his Advantages under the late King, has left the Kingdome, King Christian efusing to admit him to his Prefence.

His Majefty is refolved to have Rigorous Juffice done upon all perfons who fhall be found guilty of bearing falle Witnefs, or of Perjuty, and to eals the people from many of the Impofitions which are now upon them. All the Souldery have already Sworn Obedience to the New King

From Silefia we are told, That the Bilhop of Niffen in that *P*. ovince, has order d the Coyning of Gald Ducats, in form of Medalls, intending to make a Prefeot of 3000 of them to the Queen of Poland, in her pathage towards *Canftochow*, two thou'and more to the Empress her Mos there and 4000 to the Arch-Datchels her Sifter, in Imization of what the Eilates of Moravia had done in her pain fage through that Marquilate.

They farther affirme, They the Queen might probably reach Ggenftochow the 25th, and that the Mirriager might be Conformated the 27th of February.

From Ratisbonne they tell us, That the late ficknels of the Emperour, and the Milcantage of the Emprels, begins to put the Electoral Colledge in mind of the Conyeniency of making Choice of a King of the Romans & and, they as confidently fay, That the Subject of Monficur Gravelles Negotiation at Munchen, was principally to include the Elector of Bavaria to put an end to the Diet at Ratisboune, and to protute an Affembly of the Electors for the making choice of a King of the Romans.

In Hazgary, the Nobility, and perfons of greateft Eminency in that Kingdom, had refolved to hold an Affembly of the States, the Twelfth of March in Cafforsia, but that the Emperour had fent away the Count de Lodal, a Member of his Privy Councils and Chancellour of Hungary, with two other perfons, to diffwade them from it; but, reforing if they perfift in their Defign, contrary to his Commands, to fend fome Regiments of Horle and Foot into those parts, to fecure his Interest, and prevent them from acting any thing to the manifest difadvantage of the Imperial Crown.

Genoua, Feb. 26. The 23 inftent failed hence the Madonna de Loretto for the Goalt of Spain richly laden, and the lame day departed a Zealand man of war for Spain and Holland, having under his Convoy 7 large Buch Mer liants thips laden with Rices Lemmons and Opl. The next day put to fea the Om n and David for Legorn, and the Batchelors adventure for Maples, with part of her lading of Hirtings] entitle St Anion for Legorn with three other finips of this Port bound for Ancond, where they are defigned to lade Corn for this place.

The Genous Convov is now heltning out for Spain, confilting of two men of war and three flour Merchant fhips, and hope to find there the Gillions fafely arrived, though at yet they have no news of them.

Yesterdsy came in here the Affrican Merchant from Legorn bit this River to lade Oyls for London. S aven other small English ships are here lading, and expect the arrival of the Portland to Convoy them to the streights.

The fhip which lately arrived with the Duke d' $\delta \int \int u duke} d' \delta \int \int u duke is waiting at Bar$ cellond for favourable weather, to invite him to emborkhimfelf upon the Gallies which there attend to tranfport him to take possession of his Government ofMilan.

From Naples we are advited that the Viceroy had defined leveral Troops of Horle and Companies of Foot, to march towards Otranto, Lecca, and Licera, but has not yet given Orders for their motion till he have first information that good Quarters are assigned to entertain them.

The Viceroy of Sardinia fearing left the people of that Ifland may fuddenly break out into fome difordets to the prejudice of the Crown of Spain, has prefied hard for a speedy assistance from Naples, where she found ders are given for the fitting up of a squadron of the Gallies of that Kingdom, on which are to embath several Spanish Companies, by whose prefence tis believed that popular fury will be in little time assigned.

• Colagne, Feb. 28. Some forces of the Landgrave of Heffe being drawn neer Hanaw, the Count of that place iu pecting their intentions, refueed to give them leave to enter the lown, but difpatcht a Letter to the Prince Elector Patatine to acquaint him with the reason of his fuspicion, defiring him to prefs the Landgrave to withdraw them; fince this the Elector Palatine and Duke of Wirtemberg have upon the receipt of a Commission from His Imperial Majefty, written both to the Count de Hanaw and the Landgraves Deputies to forbear all acts of Hoftility, and feveral of the neighbor Princes are interpecting as Mediators for the compositive of all differences between ahem.

- Danizig, Mart 1. Letters of the 19th paft New file, inform us, that the King of Poland was there arrived, expecting the news of the approach of his Royal Bride, who was hindred on her way by the great fall of Snow, fo that the Marriage could not be conlummated at the time appointed : at the cloing of these Letters they had no advice of her arrival within 20 Leagues of Czenflochow, but it was not doubted but that the might arrive timely enough for the performance of that Ceremony on the Sunday following; after which, the King intended to return to Warfaw to be prefent at the opening of the General Diet the 5th inftant.

Bruffels, Mart. 11. The Officers of the Army appointed to take tare of the Reform, have done their parts, and given in an account thereof to the Conflable of Cafille for his approbation; after which it may be fuddenly publisht and put into execution. The English, Scotch and Irish Regiments are to be reduced each of them to 1000 men₂ and allowances made them for their Recrutis.

Yesterday arrived here a Spanish Courier from Madrid, telling us that the Gourr has not yet made choice of the General of the Cavalry for these Provinces, for which there are three competitors, the Prince of Parmay the Prince of Chimay, and Count Montercy,

That the Conde de Molina is deligned to be, lent Ambaffador into France, and a Nephew of Don Monzode Cardenas with the fame Character into England.

Paris, Mart. 15. Many brais Guns have been lately taken out of the Arfenal and fent away by water to Roken to be employed in his Majeflys Fleet.

The Six, fhips defigned for the East Indies under the Command of Monfieur de la Haye, are fitting up with all diligence, and may be ready by the next Month to put to fes. His Majefly ordered a Coach to be made at the Gebeling, to the value of 25 thouland Crowns, which is fent away to Roche le to be put aboard thole fhips, and is intended as a Prefent to the Great Mogul. Several Medals have been lately made in memory of the Trade fo much encouraged by his Majefly to the East Indies, having on one fulc the King, and on the other feveral Indians with this Motto, Gloriam means dicent.

Monfieur de Guilleraque is by his Majeity defigned to be fent Ambafiador to the Otoman Court, and is to have in his company 12 thips most of them lacen with Merchandile: upof his arrival there we may expect the return home of Monfieur de la Hay Ventelet, who has for fome years b.en employed in that Court under the fame Chatacter.

¹ The Turks are making extraordinary preparation fo war both by Sea and Land, and its by fome full effected left he may have encouragement to fail either upon Sicily or Naples; in the former its faid, the Duke d'Albuquerg e Viceroy of that Illand, has cauled two Greeks to be executed, they having been found to be fubjects to the Turkith Empire, and employed to take the Plain of Palermo, the principal City of that Illand : the Duke apprehending thereupon fome danger of an Invafion, has given Order for the fortifying of the principal Sea ports of his Government.

The King seems resolved to give a visit to his late Conquests in the Netherlands. He has given Order to all the Officers of his forces to repair to their Quarters and Emp oyments by the 15th of April, upon pain of being cathiered.

The 9th inftant, Monsieur and Madam arrived here from St. Germains, and have refolved to continue tome days at the Palace Royal, and the 1 oth inftant gave Audience to the Count de Rabata, Refident from the Great Duke of Tuscany, whom the next day the Sieur de Bonnevit presented from his Majesty with his Majestys Picture richly set with Diamonds.
