

United Kingdom on a date unknown between 1st December 1967 and 31st January 1968 by Mr. Slavmir Vorkapitch on condition that they would be exported when his stay in the United Kingdom came to an end or in any case not later than before the expiration of a period of twelve months from the date of importation and the said condition was not observed. Whereby and by force of sections 44 and 257 of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952, the said goods are liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said goods are not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in

accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act. If you are outside the United Kingdom this notice must specify the name and address of a solicitor in England who is authorised to accept service of process and to act on your behalf, in default of such notice the said goods will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.

COAST PROTECTION ACT, 1949

LOTHINGLAND RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Notice is hereby given that the Lothingland Rural District Council in their capacity as coast protection authority, hereby give notice under sub-section (1) of section 5 of the above Act that they propose to carry out Coast Protection Work as described herein at Hopton-on-Sea (in the Parish of Corton) in the county of Suffolk.

The work will consist of the construction of a timber revetment for a length of 517 metres (approximately 567 yards) extending southwards from the end of the present scheme adjacent to the Gorleston Golf Course North end, together with four steel and timber groynes, 60 metres (approximately 200 feet) long, spaced 120 metres (approximately 400 feet) apart. The estimated cost of the work is £100,000.

Any person may not later than the 2nd day of February 1970, serve written notice of objection to the above proposal on the Minister of Housing and Local Government and on the above-mentioned authority. Any such notice must contain a statement of the ground of objection and must be sent by prepaid post to The Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, and to the Clerk of the Authority at the address shown below.

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ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

EVESHAM BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Evesham (Street Parking Places) (Further Variation) Order 1969

Notice is hereby given that the Evesham Borough Council propose to make an Order under sections 28, 31, 32 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be to vary the Evesham (Street Parking Places) Order 1966 which has effect by virtue of section 110 (2) of and paragraph 8 of Schedule 8 to the Act of 1967 as amended by the Evesham (Street Parking Places) (Variation) Order 1969, as follows:

To restrict the existing waiting on the south side of Albert Road, from a point 36 yards west of the junction with High Street, to a point 70 yards west of the said junction, and also from a point 19 yards east of the junction with Briar Close, to a point 33 yards east of the said junction, to periods not exceeding 2 hours between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m.
