And we do bereig Direct and Commond, That the faid Day of Publick Thankf-giving be Religionfly observed by all our loving Subjects in Scorland, as they render the Favour of Almighty God, and scenario, as they tender the Education of Latinguity Oct. Bands upon pain of suffering such l'amssiment as we may justly instité ou all sean as shall contenue or Regleët the Performance of so Religious and Necessary a Duty. Our will is therefore, and we Charge that incontinent, so is our Preslamation seen, ye pass to the Market Cross of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there in our Rame and Authority, make Publication Bereef, that none present igno-rance; and our Will and Pleafar, is, That our Solictor to cause printed Copies hereof to be fout to the Sheriffs of the several Shires. Stewarts of Stewarties, and Baillies of Regalities, and their Clerks, whose we Ordain to fee the fame Published, and we appoint them to feed Doubles hereof to the everal Paroci Kirks within their Bounds; That upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the same may be Published and Read from the inspits inmediately after Divine Service.

St. Fames's, Fanuary 4. The Count Bergami, Envoy-Extraordinary from the Duke of Modena, had a private Audience of Her Majesty, to Condole the Death of his Royal Highness the Prince; conducted by Sir Charles Cotatell, Matter of the Ceremonies; and introduced by the Right Honourable the Earl of Sunderland, Principal Secretary of State.

Hague, Fanuary 3. N. S. A Gold Chain and Medal have been bestowed, by the States, upon the Sieur Vleertman, who brought the Capitulation of Ghent. Their High-Mightinesies have given their Deputies in the Army Leave to return home; and have published an Edict, wherein it is commanded, that the 16th of this Month fhall be kept Sacred throughout all the Provinces, as a Day of Thankfiving for the happy Successes of their Arms, and those of their Allies, in the Campaign now ended. There are great Preparations making for the Celebration of that Day; the Evening of which is to be elofed with the ringing of Bells, discharge of Cannon, magnificent Fireworks, and all other DemonReations of Publick Satif-The Horse-Guards are suddenly expected here, and one Battalion of the Foot-Guards is also to have their Winter-Quarters in this Place. They write from Frankfort, that the Abbot of Kempton was at present theres from whence he will, within few Days, go to Wetzlar. It is believed his Imperial Majesty will remove him, and name another Person to be President of the Aulick Conncil.
