A PROCLAMATION.

For Encouraging Seamen and Landmon to Enter themfelves on Board Her Majesty's Ships of War.

Hereas it is our Royal Intention to give all due Encou ragement to all fush Seamen and Able bodied Landmen, who shall voluntarily Enter themselves in our Service, and remain on Board our thirs of War in our Royal Navy, we have thought for (by and with the Advice of our 'rivy-Council) to Publish this our Royal Proclamation; And We do hereby Promise and Declare. That all such Seamen, and Able-bodied Lanimes (not above the Age of Fifty five Years, and not under the Age of Sixteen Years) who on or between the Thirtieth Day of this Infant December, and the Twenty fifth Day of March next, shall Voluntarily Enter themselves in Our Service with a Commission-Officer of any of Our Ships of War, or with any Justice of the Peace, or Chief Magistrate of any Town, or with any Vice-Almiral, to ferve on Board any of our Ships or Veffels of War, (Ten. ders only excepted) shall receive, as our free Gift and Royal Bounty, the respective Rewards and Allowances following; (That is to fay) every such Seaman two Months Pay, and every such Able-bodied Landman one Months Pay, to be paid to them respectively by the Principal Officers and Commis-Coners of our Navy, before the respective Ships, on which shey finall be, do proceed to Sea. And We do hereby require and direct. That if any fuch Seaman, or Able bodied Lind. man. shall, wishin the time before-mentioned, enter himself with any Justice of the Peace, or Cnef Magistrate of any Town, or with any Vice-Almiral, or other Commission Offcer. to serve on Board any of our Ships of War. or other Vessels before mentioned. Such Justice of the Peace, or Chi-f Magistrate, Vice Admiral, or other Commission-Officer re spectively shall give to each Man so entring a Cers, sizate under his Hand and Seal, without Fee or Reward, of his Entry, and the time of fuch Entry, and for what Soip, and Shall thereby limit such a number of Days (not exceeding fourteen Days) as may be necessary for his repairing on Fourt fuch Ship, or any other Ship, Tender or Bomb Vessel in our Service, at the next Fort which shall be appointed to receive And we do hereby declare, That all fuch Seamen, and Able bo ied Landmen, who wishin the time aforefaid, shall enter themselves, as aforesaid, and within the time limired and appointed in fuch Certificate, repair on Board any of our faid Snips or Tenders appointed to receive them, (according to their Qualifications aforefaid, and not otherwie) shall be entituted to our Royal Bounty herein before appointed, and intended for them respectively, and to their Pay from the time of their first Entring with such Justice of the Peace, or other Officer, as ajorefuld; And that they shall be allowed time without Molestation to render themselves ox Board our Ships of War: And therefore we do hereby reourre and command all Captains commanding any of our Ships of War, or other our Ships, and allother Persons whatfoever, authorized or impowered to impress Mariners for our Service. That they do not impress any such Seamen, or Able bodied Landmen, to whom fuch Certificate, as aforefaid, finall be given, according to the true Intent and Meaning of this our Rayal Proclamation, or any Men now in our Serties our Kayat troctamation, or any men now mour Service, who by Tickets figured by any of our Flag Officers, have or finall have leave to be abjent from their Duty to the faid swenty fifth Day of Much, before they fixed full to remain themselves on Board Juch of our faid Skips or Veffile, on which they fixed enter themselves to ferve, or to which they fail before according to the Time lemical he which they faul belong. according to the Time limited by fuen Certificates or Tickets; her any Person or Persons prorested, or implesed in the River, or on the Coufts. by the Commiffeners of four Navy, Ordnauce, Victualing, Cu flams, or Teansportation, or the Watermen in our Service. And to the end we may be tridy informed what Persons shall fo enter and render themselves to serve on Board our Fleet. expursioner of this our Royal Proclamation, we do bereby require and comman i our repedine Captains commanding any of our faid Ships of War, or other our Ships or Veffel.

as aforefield, and also all Justices of the Peace, chief Midg frates, Vice-Admirals, and other Commission Officers aforefield respectively, to transmit to the principal Officers and Commissioners of our Navy exact Lists and Accounts of the Names, Ages and Descriptions of the Persons who small to-luntarily enter themselves with them, and the Time when, and Place where, and for what ship, and of the Time which shall be allowed them respectively for rendring themselves on Board, and of the Time of their respective regaining on Board any of our faid Ships. And we do hereby require and command the faid Scamen and Landmen to repair on Beard the respective Ships, on which they shall seener them-selves, or to which they shall belong, within the Time limited by such Certificates or Ticket, on Paint of our highest Displeasure. And we are graciously pleased further to declare, That Conduct-Mony, according to the Practice of the Navy; first be allowed to all fuch Seamen and Landmen fo Voluntarily entring themselves on Board, according to the true Meaning of this our Royal Proclamation. And for preven-ting any Deceits or Abufes which may hoppen by any Perfon or Perfons leaving the Ships to which they belong, and entring him or themselves on Board any other of our Ships, in order to obtain the Bounty-Men; herein before granted, we do hereby likewise direct, declare and command, That such Seamen and Lanamen belonging to any of car Ships or Vessils wants sover, as shall absent themseives from any of the Ships or Veffels to which they Itali briong, and shall enter Ships or Vegets. To moich they mail brong, and incidenter themselves on Board any other of our Skips, in order to obtain the said Bounty-Nony, shall not only lose the Wages due to them in the Ships they shall so leave, but also shall be severely purished according to their Demerits. And, we do hereby further declare. That if such Men in our Service, who are or shall be permitted to be absent by such Tickets, as aforestid, do not repair on Board their respective. Ships the shall not only be by the Time allowed by fuch Tickets, they find! not only be isable to be imprest but to suffer such other Punishment as by Law may be inflicted on them for fuch their Neglect. And we do hereb; require all our Justices of the Peace, and other wing strates, and also all our Captains of our Ships, and other, who shall be imployed in Impressing Men for our Fires, That they take particular Care nos to take up, Impress or Entertain any very old Men, Boys, or others, who by resson of Instrmity, or otherwise, are not filly qualified for our Service in our Royal Navy, for that none sach shall be received by the Officers of our Fleet into our Service. And we do bereby require and command all our Justices of the Peace, Chief Magistrates, Constables, and other Officers. That they do use their utmost Endeavours to secure, fend and deliver to the Commissioners of our Navy at some near Sea-Port Town, or to such other l'erson as shall be appointed to receive them, all fuch Seamen, Watermen, Barge. men and Lightermen, fit for our Service, as shall be found stragling, in order to their being put on Board eur Fleet in our Service, and that of what they shall do therein, they from time to time send an Account to the Commissioners of our Navy. And we do hereby direct the respective Officers of our Fleet. who shall receive such Seamen, to give Re-ceipts for them, therein expressing the Names of such Seamen. and on Board what Ship or Vessel, and the time when, and the place where they are received. And the Commissioners of our Navy are kereby directed to give Order, upon producing (at any Port where there are Officers immediately under their Directions) the faid Receipts, to pay to the Person producing the sime, twenty Shillings for each Seaman, and fix Pence per Man for each Mile he shall be brought above twenty Miles. And we do hereby declare. That no Prote-thion of any Man in any Ships or Vessels imployed in the Ri-ver, or on the Coast, by the Commissioner, of our Many Ordnonce, Victualling. Customs or Transfertation. Shall be in Force for more than fix Monins from the Date thereof (except fuch as shall be signed by our Lord High Admiral y And see do fur her direct, That in all Protections the lerfons kanot only numed, but described by their lace of Refinence, and imployment, and Service for which try are Protected. And that if any of the faid Perfow shall be found upon the Water in any other service than what they are prosected for, they fall be leave to be Imprest, except the Was

Bruffels, Jan. 11. N. S. His Grace the Duke of Marlborough, and Prince Eugene, left this Place on the 9th Instant in the Morning, Count Tilli, who has commanded the Troops of the States-General fince the Death of Felt-Marshal Auverguerque, is at present Commander in Chief of the Armies of the Allies in Flanders. The Troops are drawing off to their Winter-Quarters; and the Officers of each Regiment who are appointed to raise Recruits, will receive their Orders within few Days to go to those Countries in which they are to Levy their Men. We are advised from the Frontiers, that the Troops which formed the late Garrison of the Enemy in Ghent, are already dispersed into their several Quarters. Letters from France fay, that a Council, at which the Mareschals of France were summoned to attend, was held at Court on the 4th Infant, in which the present State of the War was under confideration; but the Resolutions taken at that time are kept very secret. These Letters add, that sour Regiments of Foot, and sour of Horse, are ordered to follow the 8000 Men who larely marched out of Dauphine into Flanders. 26 Battalions, and 39 Squadrons, are also commanded to march thither out of Aliace. The Difficulties in raising Mony for the present Exigencies of the War are so great, that there is a new Tax imposed, which obliges the Landlord of each House throughout Paris, and the Suburbs of it, to pay four Pence out of every Livre he receives for Rent, and the Tenant to pay two Pence for every Livre he pays to his Landlord. The Mony arising from this new Impolition is immediately to be paid into the King's Officers, without being touched by the Farmers of the Revenue. They write from Namur, that there has been a Mutiny in that Garrison for want of Pay, the Soldiers having broken open the Warehouses of such Tradesmen as fold any fort of Victuals or Provisions, and taken away

their Goods by force. Oftend, January 12. N. S. They write from Antwerp, that the Duke of Marlborough and Prince Eugene arrived there on the 9th Instant, and next Morning proceeded towards the Hague. The Capitulation of the Magistrates of Ghent for their own Privileges, and the Civil Rights of that Place, was Sign'd on the first Instant, and con-fisted of 26 Arricles; the chief end of which is to pre-ferve the Exercise of their Religion, the Revenues and Immunities of all Religious Houses, Persons and Foundations, as well as all the Privileges which that City it felf enjoy'd in the Reign of Charles II. It is also provided, that the present Officers of the Government shall be removed, or still enjoy their Places, as shall be thought most for the Service of King Charles III. but that all Hereditary Employments and Hereditary Rights to Em-Playments, shall continue in the same rersons who held them in that Reign; and that all Engagements relating to Publick Creoit, shall be inviolably observed. This Capitulation was subscribed by A.X. Triest Aughem on the Sat of the Town; and in behalf of the Allies, by his Grace the Duke of Marlborough, and the Deputies of the Status-General.
