Gloucestershire County Council (Various Paths, South Cerney) Public Path Extinguishment Order 1970

Notice is hereby given that on the 10th February 1970, the Gloucestershire County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed is to extinguish:

- (i) Footpath BSC 23 from a point 250 yards west-north-west of Trinity Church, Cerney Wick extending north-west to the Cerney Wick/South Cerney Road.
- (ii) Footpath BSC 24 from its junction with public footpath BSC 23 to the western corner of parcel No. 194 at the rear of Orchard Cottage, Cerney Wick.
- (iii) Footpath BSC 25 from the disused railway line to its junction with public footpath BSC 23 at a point 280 yards west-north-west of Trinity Church, Cerney Wick.
- (iv) Footpath BSC 26 from the entrance to the South Cerney Sailing Centre on the South Cerney/Cerney Wick Road to its junction with public footpath BSC 25, 436 yards west of Trinity Church, Cerney Wick.

New footpaths will be created as follows:

- (1) From the junction of public footpath BSC 23 with the Cerney Wick/South Cerney Road extending in northerly direction and continuing along the northern and north-eastern perimeter of parcel No. 194 to join public footpath BSC 24 at the rear of Orchard Cottage, Cerney Wick.
- (2) From the entrance to the South Cerney Sailing Centre extending south following the eastern boundaries of parcel Nos. 245 and 202 to the north-eastern boundary of the disused railway line along the side of the railway, turning north-east to follow the eastern boundary of parcel No. 22, south-east along the southern and eastern boundaries of parcel No. 55, north-east along the eastern boundaries of parcel Nos. 57 and 197 to join the footpath BSC 23.
