quickly to hold a mob of some 1,500-2,000 persons and to support the Royal Ulster Constabulary. Shortly after they arrived, the police asked for help. Private James was detailed as one of three marksmen for the difficult and dangerous task of identifying persons shooting or throwing petrol bombs at the soldiers and police and neutralising the hostile fire under specific instructions. For a period of over four hours he remained constantly exposed to fire in an open and largely unprotected position, during which time the butt of his rifle was shot away. In spite of this he calmly sought a replacement and continued this he calmly sought a replacement and continued

The performance of this young soldier was exemplary and in keeping with the highest traditions both of his Regiment and of the British Army. Throughout the whole of the action Private James showed outstanding courage and steadiness. His actions prevented the snipers from causing more casualties to his comrades, the police and the civil population. His conduct was far in excess of the normal call of duty and was an example to all who saw him.

On the night 11th/12th October 1969, rioting broke out in the Shankill district of Belfast. Elements of the Third Battalion The Light Infantry were moved quickly to hold a mob of some 1,500-2,000 persons and to support the Royal Ulster Constabulary, Shortly and to support the koyal Olster Constabiliary. Shortly after they arrived, the police asked for help. For the next few hours the hard core element of the mob became vicious and hostile. They used automatic weapons against the soldiers and police as well as throwing petrol bombs, paving stones, bottles, darts and ball bearings from catapults.

and ball bearings from catapults.

Sergeant Power was the non-commissioned officer in charge of a squad of men known as the baton squad. These men were unarmed except for short stout batons. Their primary task was to effect arrests of ringleaders of the rioting mob. The task was difficult and highly dangerous as the Shankill road was under continuous small arms fire from all sides. The squad was used to charge the leading elements of the mob after CS smoke had been used and to extricate the ringleaders.

Between about 2330 hours 11th October 1969 and

0430 hours 12th October 1969, Sergeant Power personally organised and led some fifteen charges at the rioting mob in the face of heavy fire. Frequently their charges took them within 15 yards of gunmen. Several members of the baton squad

or gurmen. Several members of the baton squad were wounded.

Sergeant Power, by his calm and resolute control of the baton squad, by his personal example of bravery and endurance inspired all the men under his command. His action led to the arrest of many

ringleaders.
