No keep net shall be used by an angler fishing with rod and line within the River Authority Are unless (a) it is made of netting, not being metal, having a mesh of a size not less than one quarter of an inch from knot to knot measured on each side of the square when wet and (b) it is fitted with top and bottom stretching rings or frames not less than 4 feet apart and of not less than 12 inches in diameter if circular or 12 inches by 9 inches if rectangular and fitted with intermediate rings or frames of the same dimensions placed along the length of the net at intervals of not less than 6 inches nor more than 10 inches.

During a period of one calendar month from the date of publication of this notice, a printed copy of the said Byelaw will be deposited at the Offices of the Authority at The Cedars, Albemarle Road, Norwich, and will be open to public inspection, without charge, on any weekday (except Saturday) during the usual office hours.
