CIVIC AMENITIES ACT 1967-PART I

Notice of Designation of Conservation Areas Notice is hereby given that Surrey County Council, as Local Planning Authority, in pursuance of section 1 of the Civic Amenities Act 1967, have designated the areas described in the Schedule below as Conservation Areas.

SCHEDULE

DORKING AND HORLEY RURAL DISTRICT

Commencing at Betchworth Street just north of Home Farm barns the boundary line runs eastwards as far as the cricket ground and then turns southwards along its western boundary to cross Wonham Lane and the River Mole. Running along the eastern bank of the River Mole the boundary passes behind bank of the River Mole the boundary passes behind Fryleigh and then turns south-westwards to enclose Fryleigh Cottages, crosses the continuation of Betchworth Street, Footpath No. F.P.455, the River Mole and then runs northwards in a fairly straight line along the western fence of Betchworth House grounds to enclose it and the Parish Church with Church Street and continues as far as Footpath No. F.P.459A. At this point the line turns eastward to link with the starting point just north of Home Farm.

Buckland

The boundary line commences in Rectory Green Lane and runs along the northern curtilage of the property known as Garth passing on through the woodland behind to turn southwards and then run along the field edge as far as Footpath No. F.P.473. The line follows the northern side of F.P.473 in north-easterly direction and after enclosing Slough House turns southwards across open fields to meet Footpath No. F.P.474A. Running southwards along the eastern edge of F.P.474A the line crosses the A.25 Reigate Road to turn westwards behind Round Lodge and run along the field boundary behind Buckland Court. Crossing Bridleway No. B.W.467 just south of The Lodge to Buckland Lodge the line continues over Bridleway No. B.W.464 along the southern side of White House to cross Buckland Street and turn northwards again on the western Street and turn northwards again on the western side of Broome Perrow and Broome Perrow Cottage to recross the A.25 Reigate Road just east of Pineaster. Running northwards along the eastern boundary of Pineaster the line then turns eastwards along the north side of Heswall Grange to rejoin the starting point in Rectory Green Lane.

Commencing at Longbridge in Charlwood Parish the boundary line runs north-west for a distance of approximately 300 yards and then turns northeast to cross the River Mole into Horley Parish and east to cross the River Mole into Horley Parish and continue for approximately 200 yards linking with the line of Footpath No. F.P.384 as far as the Cemetery. The line then turns south-west and follows the boundary of the cemetery to cross Church Road 100 yards north-east of the Six Bells Public House and passing behind the properties fronting Church Road, runs south-west to meet the Churchyard. Following the north-eastern and then the south-eastern sides of the Churchyard the line continues along the north-western side of the Brighton road to rejoin the starting point at Longbridge. to rejoin the starting point at Longbridge.

Leigh
Commencing approximately 320 feet north-east of Leigh Place, the boundary line runs southwards, roughly parallel with road D.320 and across Footpath No. F.P.425 for a distance of approximately 1,400 feet to the field boundary where it turns southwestwards to cross Footpath No. F.P.430 and then continue to and cross Charlwood Road (C.57). It then turns north as far as the School, south to include part of Clayhill Road, then northwards to enclose the Vicarage and western part of the Green. Turning eastward again the line crosses Tapners Road runs along the rear boundary of The Plough Public House passing behind other properties fronting the Green and then turns north alongside Barn Cottage. The line continues northwards roughly parallel to road D.320 until it reaches a point about 250 feet north-west of Leigh Place, where it turns eastwards to enclose Leigh Place and link with the starting point. starting point.

EGHAM URBAN DISTRICT

The Hythe

The boundary of the Conservation Area follows The boundary of the Conservation Area follows the Urban District Boundary in mid-stream of the River Thames from Staines Bridge to a point just west of Hythe End House. The boundary then turns south-east through The Fernery and its garage court to cross Chertsey Lane, and then follows the north side of Boleyn Close, excluding Nos. 6 and 7 Boleyn Close, thereafter turning south and then west to the Urban District Boundary at Staines Bridge approach. Bridge approach.

Englefield Green

The boundary encloses Englefield Green House and runs east then turns south-west along the rear of properties on the east side of Clarence Dr of properties on the east side of Clarence Drive. Continuing east the boundary runs over Tite Hill, behind Bulkeley House and across Barley Mow Road to enclose "The Vicarage". It then turns north-west to pass behind Byways and the Barley Mow Public House to cross Northcroft Road, pass around Crown Cottage bringing Barons Mead and the immediate buildings of Castle Hill Farm into the area. The boundary then turns north to Englefield Green House where it turn east and completes the boundary.

The boundary of the Conservation Area runs west along the north boundary of Cottage Farm, which is excluded, and turns north to enclose Anners and the Red Lion Public House. After crossing Village Road to the west of Little Timbers the line turns west and then north along the north-west of Village Road. The boundary turns south-east along the east side of Ten Acre Lane and then runs in an easterly direction some 150 feet north of Coldharbour Lane as far as Manor Cottage where of Coldharbour Lane as far as Manor Cottage where of Coldharbour Lane as far as Manor Cottage where it turns south to Coldharbour Lane. From that point it encloses Eastly End Cottage, the junction with Norland Lane, and Eastly End House. The boundary then continues in a westerly direction approximately parallel to Coldharbour Lane to enclose Manorhouse Farm and the Parish Church, and then turns south to include the grounds of Spelthorne St. Mary. From The Moat the line follows Mill Lane and the Village Road to complete the boundary at Cottage Farm. Cottage Farm.

FARNHAM URBAN DISTRICT

Farnham

The boundary of the Conservation Area commences just west of the junction of West Street and Crondall Lane and runs eastwards along the rear boundaries of the properties fronting the north side of West Street as far as Potters Gate.

It then turns northwards to enclose the Urban District Council's Old People's dwellings at College Gardens before turning eastwards to run parallel with West Street as far as Long Garden Walk West where it turns northwards to encompass the Castle where it turns northwards to encompass the Castle and its environs.

The boundary then turns southwards along the western boundary of Farnham Park into Bear Lane and South Street. Some 200 feet along the latter it turns behind the frontage development to enclose the Bush Hotel and its gardens and continues south-ward crossing Victoria Road and turning westward again in Union Road, enclosing Church House. The line continues to the Downing Street junction

and thence along Longbridge to include properties in Bridge Square and the western part of Abbey Street. The boundary runs westward along Red Lion Lane and Weydon Mill Lane to enclose the water meadows,
