

before returning along the line of the public footpath which crosses the meadows to the Parish Church.

East of Messrs. Crosby's, it turns north and then westward again to enclose properties in Mead Lane continuing along the rear boundary of the residential properties on the south side of West Street to rejoin its starting point near to the Crondall Lane, West Street junction.

HAMBLEDON RURAL DISTRICT

Alfold

The boundary for this Conservation Area is drawn quite tightly round the existing development in the village. Commencing on the Loxwood Road (B.2133) just north of Alford House Farm and enclosing Footpath F.P.405, the boundary runs east to include the tiled and boarded farm barns then turns south behind Alford House to a point 270 feet south-east of Loxwood Road along Footpath F.P.406. Running west the boundary encloses the curtilages of Cherry Tree Cottage and Hillside where it rejoins and runs south along the east side of Loxwood Road. The boundary then crosses the road and runs along the south and west curtilages of The Rectory, passing through the Cemetery and includes Footpath F.P.422 as far as Rosemary Lane. Crossing Rosemary Lane and enclosing Footpath F.P.411 it continues behind the village street to rejoin and continue north along the west side of Loxwood Road to complete the boundary at Footpath F.P.405.

Ewhurst

The boundary commences just north of High Edser Farm where it includes the farm buildings and continues south to the east of the Shere Road (C.46) to cross the B.2127 road and pass to the east of the Bulls Head Hotel along the rear boundary, roughly parallel to and between 150 feet and 200 feet to the east of the B.2127, as far as Winton House. The line turns south-east to enclose the Parish Church, and then turns south and west around the Old Rectory and part Cemetery including the area known as The Mount. After crossing the B.2127 Road and enclosing The School the boundary runs north behind all the properties fronting the B.2127 and Shere roads to complete the boundary north of High Edser Farm.

Thursley

The boundary commences at the south (rear) boundary of the Three Horseshoes and continues in a south and south-west direction behind the properties to the west and east side of Highfield Lane until it reaches bridleway B.W.83 on the south side of Hatch Cottages. At this point it turns west and south again to enclose Footpath F.P.84 for a distance of approximately 250 feet south where it then turns west to cross Highfield Lane and continues as far as the rear boundary of Ambleside.

At this point the boundary turns north to enclose the Churchyard and its extension by running along the south side of the field owned by the National Trust. It continues north along the east boundary of that field and encloses the line of a small water-course as far as the bottom of Back Lane where it turns north again to cross the road (C.30) and enclose the Cricket and Children's Playgrounds. The boundary turns north-east and continues along bridleway B.W.110 to the north boundary of Thorcroft where it turns east to meet bridleway B.W.110B. Running south and enclosing that bridleway the line

then crosses the road (C.30) to enclose the Three Horseshoes and complete the boundary.

Witley

The boundary commences some 200 feet north of the junction of Northfield with The Street, encloses properties to the north of Footpath No. F.P.128, turns to follow the line of this footpath and then continues east to the Railway, which is followed to the south as far as Footpath No. F.P.133. The boundary then turns north-west to pass south of the Chichester Hall. The boundary continues west to cross The Street, Footpath No. F.P.134 and the sunken road to include The Lodge and the smaller estate Lodge before continuing in a north-west direction behind the tree screen on the west of Churchfields for approximately 200 yards. The line then turns north-east across undeveloped land crossing Footpath No. F.P.136 to complete the boundary on the east side of The Street.

SUNBURY-ON-THAMES URBAN DISTRICT

Shepperton

The boundary commences at the western end of the Conservation Area by enclosing The Little Cottage and Church House, and then follows Chertsey Road to the Anchor Garage where it turns north to enclose the Old Cemetery. It then turns east to Winches Cottages (Ivy Cottage) south along Church Road to the north boundary of the Anchor Hotel, east behind The Rectory, and across the Manor House grounds to Manor House Cottage. The line then runs in a south-easterly direction to the south of War Close and Manor Park Cricket Ground and then back in a westerly direction along the River Thames to enclose the north bank of the river. The line continues to the west and then north to include The Creek and Creek House, and completes the boundary at Chertsey Road.
